

Barque Fortune of New Bedford Capt Hathaway

Remarks on Friday Oct 24th

Began with a light breeze from S. and pleasant weather lying off and on at Kila for Capt 2 P.M. he came off we stood off S. by E. set fore top mast studding sail 3 P.M. saw Moore bearing N. W. dist 50 miles sundown North Point of Owhyhee bearing West midnight we stood off at 6 A.M. East Point of Moore bore W. & W. 6 miles off saw one sail so ends ~~the~~ W. & W. in for Lohiana

Remarks on Saturday Oct 25th

First and middle part light trades and fine weather ~~the~~ in for snow passage at sundown the North Point of Moore about 5 miles off Morotai bore W. & W. East Point at midnight we hauled aback in between Ranai & Moore latter part we had becalmed at 6 A.M. Capt went on shore to Ende's Anchorage thence to Soukum

Remarks on Sunday Oct 26th

Bore with baffling winds and fine weather beating up to port of Lohiana Capt on shore at 2 P.M. came to abreast of the fort in 16 fms of water 10 miles from shore and pulled the sails and sent the men ashore that we ship by the Cruise latter light breeze and fine the cook cut his great toe off lying to split a stick of wood So ends

Remarks on Monday Oct 27th

Fine pleasant weather got off ten Bushels of Potatoes and Discharged Bowlin, Moody John, and Brown one Boatstewer came off that we ship Monroons Hand is done better we Discharged Third Mate

Remarks on Tuesday Oct 28th

At Anchor Capt on shore shipping men ship ^{three} Canakcas one Boatstewer and Third mate they all came off aboard at 1 A.M. called hands and got under way with light air off the land and stood out to the latter showed the anchors & unbent the chains at Noon. Tahomowa bore ~~to~~ E. & S. dist 6 miles Cooks toe is very painful

Remarks on Wednesday Oct 29th

Bore with fresh trades and fine weather ~~the~~ S. & E. with all drawing sail set watch employed in running the cables below at sundown breeze freshened we took in top gallant sails & double reefed the top sails saw Owhyhee bearing East at 10 P.M. wind abated and shifted to Westward latter light air and hot weather watch employed in Puntig ship Cooks foot is done easier Monroons finger getting better So ends South point of Owhyhee bearing E. & S. dist 16 ^{miles}

Remarks on Thursday Oct 30th

First part calm and very hot weather watch employed in Puntig ship at sundown the North Point of Owhyhee was about 8 miles at 9 P.M. the trades set in strong we ~~the~~ South took in light sails single reefed fore top sail So ends Cook is getting along Lat by obs 18.00 Long by act 156.20 East

Remarks on Friday Oct 31

All these 24 hours strong trades and weather fine with rough sea ~~the~~ S. & E. watch employed in ship duty Monroons Hand getting better Cooks foot is doing well So ends Lat by obs 16.00 North Long by act 156.18 West

Remarks on Saturday Nov 1st

These 24 hours strong trades with light showers of rain ~~the~~ S. & E. under reefed top sails and courses watch variously employed about the ship invalids and cripples some better So ends

Lat 14.20 Long by obs 155.7 West

Remarks on Sunday Nov 2nd

Strong trades and clear weather ~~the~~ S. & E. Cooper same with the Rheumatism, Third Mate is sick Monroons & Cook getting better So ends Lat 11.58 North

Remarks on Monday Nov 3rd

This Day strong trades and clear weather ~~the~~ S. & E. carrying all present sail saw ship ~~the~~ S. & E. watch variously employed about the ship, we saw several Finbacks So ends Lat 9.53 North Long 154.48 West

Remarks on Tuesday Nov 4th

Bore with fresh trades and cloudy ~~the~~ S. & E. main top gallant sail out at 3 P.M. wind shifted on a squall to S. & S. Middle and latter fresh breeze from S. & S. with rain at intervals at Day light saw school of black fish round the boats and chased them did not get any So ends Cooper Monroons some better Cook & Third Mate no better Lat 8.36

Remarks on Wednesday Nov 5th

Long 155.6

First part fresh breeze from East and cloudy ~~the~~ S. & E. under double reefed top sails & courses saw some Porpoises and cowfish latter fresh gales and hard squalls of rain closed down the top sails and hauled up courses and ~~the~~ South So ends Lat by act 6.50 North Long by act 154.56

Remarks on Thursday Nov 6th

Bore with heavy gales from East thick rainy weather ~~the~~ South under double reefed top sails at 2 P.M. took in all sail to a reduced main top sail and drove to on S. & S. back then blowing hard and rough sea on at 6 P.M. abated some set double reefed top sails & set off with at Daylight ~~the~~ S. & E. latter fresh gales and frequent showers of rain So ends invalids about the same Lat by act 6.20 Long by act 154.22
