Remarks on Friday Feb 7th

Lying at anchor all aboard employed in ships duty sent for Dr. West

Remarks on Saturday Feb 8th

This day moderate breeze and fine weather men employed in in get ready for sea ship. Then for book he came aboard Stephen sick with Pox, Canon off duty sick, So ends

Remarks on Sunday Feb 9th

Pleasant weather and light breeze four men came off boat we shipped, Canon, and Stephen is no better So ends

Remarks on Monday Feb 10th

At Day light water tank came along side we took in 120 Barrels of Water and got 14 some fowls and small stores at noon took the anchor got under way and beat out of weather passage got the Anchor on the Bow and heaved them latter strong gales and stormy weather after by the wind with the 14 tackles aboard under double reef Top sails My self below sick with cold and fever

Remarks on Tuesday Feb 11th

This day commences strong Breeze from the N.E. Heaving 14 in under double reef Top sails Tatter Sails much the same Stephen sick with Pox Michel sick Ten sick My self below cold

Wednesday 12th this day commences with strong Breeze from the N.E. Heaving 14 in under double reef Top sails Tatter Sails much the same Michel and Pracey Stephen no better My self below

Remarks on Board Thursday Feb 13th commences with strong Breeze from the N.E. Heaving 14 in under double reef Top sails at 6 AM shook the rope out of the main Top sail at 3 PM Jack ship Heaving 14 in Tatter Sails same in like made sail calm Stephen

No better Ten no better Michel no better Samuel below Mr Davis no better Sub. Feb 21st 1852 Long 114 16

Heaving 14 in at two AM Jack ship Heaving 14 in under double reef out of the top sails at twelve PM Jack ship Heaving 14 in Tatter Sails same in like making short tacks spoke chain Gunb thick water Stephen and Ten no better Ten no better Mr Davis no better So ends this day Sub.
