Remarks on Sunday May 9th

These 24 hours light breezes from North and fine clear weather ~~the~~ by compass carrying all sail at 2 PM lost sight of 16 herings ~~the~~ bearing N E latter saw two Wright Whales at 9 AM saw Promotiky Cape bearing N W 30 Ends Capt very sick, carrying

Remarks on Monday May 10th

Came with light baffling wind and fine weather latter fresh gales from SE and thick snow storm the N E at 11 AM took in jib & main sail double reefed the top sails Capt, no better. 30 Ends

Remarks on Tuesday May 11th

First and middle part heavy gales from East to North at 1 PM took in fore sail & hove to on Lb tack at 4 closed reefed main at 10 took in fore sail & set spencers then blowing heavy and shipping considerable water latter it moderated we wore ship and made sail 30 Ends one sail in sight Capt no better

Remarks on Wednesday May 12th

These 24 hours moderate breezes from Westward and clear weather carrying all sail and working to westward, 2 PM spoke Barque Harriet of Fairhaven at 10 AM saw Cape Shipounsky bearing N by E dist 60 miles Capt no better

Lat 53:10

Remarks on Thursday May 13th

First part light airs from Westward pleasant weather beating to windward middle and latter calms noon Shipounsky Cape bore N by E by compass dist 40 miles 30 Ends, Capt, worse, Lat 53:15

Long 161:00 E

Remarks on Friday May 14th

First & latter part calms middle part fresh breezes from Westward all sail out beating to windward Cape Shipounsky bore N by E dist 12 miles

Capt, is more quiet to day 30 Ends Lat 53:15

Remarks on Saturday May 15th

These 24 hours light baffling winds and fine weather the N E in for Awatka Bay at noon it bore W by S dist 16 miles Awatka volcano bore N by E at 6 AM bent the chains 30 Ends Capt no better

Lat 52:45

Bound to Awatka Bay AD 1852

Remarks on Sunday May 16th

First and middle part light variable winds and fine weather latter fresh breezes from Westward, the in for Awatka Bay at 10 o'clock AM we passed inside of the Islands 30 Ends beating up to the anchorage got the anchors off the Bore 30 Ends Capt no better

Remarks on Monday May 17th

Began with fresh breezes from West and fine weather and stirring in for the anchorage at 1 PM came to anchor of the Cemetery in 12 fathoms of water and furled the sails at 2 the boarding officer came aboard at 6 PM took the Captain on shore and put him under the Doctors charge likewise the Boy Hayward to attend upon him, latter light breezes from South and snow, we filled up scuttle butts Mate on Shore crew all aboard

Remarks on Tuesday May 18th

These 24 hours thick Snowy weather we landed 16 Barrels of oil to meet the Capt, expenses I went on Shore and found the Captain more comfortable 30 Ends

Remarks on Wednesday May 19th

This Day calms and cloudy weather myself on Shore with Capt, find very bad in the last stages of Consumption the Doctors pronounced his case hopeless

Remarks on Thursday May 20th

Moderate breezes and pleasant weather we got off two Barrels of fish all on board waiting to see how it is going with Capt, Capt is very bad

Remarks on Friday May 21st

Light breezes from South and pleasant weather and lying at anchor Capt lying at point of death Russian Barque Sami came in

Remarks on Saturday May 22nd

Fine pleasant weather and light breezes from South to all on board Capt, failing fast

Remarks on Sunday May 23rd

Fresh breezes and cloudy weather at twenty past 9 AM Capt Hathaway died he went off very easy
