Remarks on Board Saturday Oct 29th
Commenced with strong breeze from N. steering down
through the Dargie at 4 PM bent the chain and
got the duckboard of the bows at 5 PM ran the ship
out lying at anchor at 7 PM left to with main yard
5 what Capt out ashore latter part lying at anchor
The hulk left ashore at 12 PM Capt arrived.

Remarks on Board Sunday Oct 30th
Commenced with like breeze from N heading in for
The hulk at 2 PM came to in position at
of water in the road of macker caught in the
latter part much the same starboard water than
on Liberty as under this day

Remarks on Board Monday Oct 31st
Commenced with like breeze from N heading in for
Port mackerel catch shore on Liberty at sundown
all came of latter part with employed of boat
got one raft ashore and discharge second mack
Mr Wing and Baker one hulk and ship sick men
to end this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday Oct 2nd
Commenced with like breeze from N at lying in Port
all hands employed house latter part got of
one raft of water employed in painting ship
Discharged the Malt Mr Tobes and Boatstewer
Adams and sent Lucas to the Hospital

Remarks on Board Wednesday Oct 3rd
First part employed in painting ship and
breaking out provisions lying in Port

Remarks on Board Thursday Oct 4th
Lying in port with fine weather and light winds
employed in storing water between decks and sending
a raft of water ashore to be filled and painting ship
according to agreement with Capt William Davis myself
the latter commenced duty on board of Barge Fortune as mate

Remarks for Friday Oct 29th
Lying in the port of macker with fine weather and light winds
employed in different jobs about ship and painting

Remarks for Saturday Oct 30th
Lying in the port of macker with fine weather and light winds
employed toward of raft of water and stowed it down fore hole
with exception of 6 casks cleared up decks discharged 3 natives and
american boys John Haywood

Remarks for Sunday 31st
Lying in port with fine weather and light winds lying Sunday
in employment part of the men went ashore on Liberty and returned
at sundown with the exception of one called William from the ship
ashore all night

Remarks for Monday Nov 1st
Lying in the port of macker with fine weather and light winds
employed in stowing of the hatchways and running water in the
tanks washing decks mending a boat for sale discharged seven
mass cannon pulled from collies by Stephen mention and boatstewer
George

Remarks for Tuesday Nov 2nd
Lying in the port of macker with fine weather and pleasant
winds employ in setting up rigging and collecting some things
such as 1 keg Pot from ship macker 1 bl lime from ship
1 keg iron 1 keg latter from ship. Every ship 2 boatstewers which
brought their things aboard made a boatstewer of one man that
came from home in the ship in forecabin got capt bathway the
former capt thing together to send home by ship midday

Remarks for Wednesday Nov 3rd
Lying in the port of macker with thick weather and drizzling
rain and fresh winds at times employed in getting from
the shore 4 bls molasses 4 bags sugar 2 small casks tea 1 box of
tin ware landed 1 whale boat 1 bl oil in exchange for potatoes
mushrooms bananas &c set up gal. gals. more overboard
one broken try Pot secured on board 1 boat load of
vegetables
