Remarks for ~~Thursday~~ Nov 16th

This day commences with fresh winds from Eastward heading S E all sail set middle and last strong winds and cloudy weather watch employed in fixing waist boat repairing rigging and dressing out a spar for fly gib boom. Fly sick with dysentery Capt very much better. Lat 18° 29' N Long 155° 00'

Remarks for Thursday Nov 17th

This day commences with strong winds from E with clear weather middle very squally took in topgallantails and double reefed topsail last squalls broke shock out the rags and set main topgallantail heading S E our coarse employ in drawing and knotting yarns fitting a preventer back stay on S gallantmast setting up the weather back stay and mounds and weather gib guy and other small jobs about ship fly still sick the cook fell down the storage ladder and lamed his back so he off duty Thomas of duty sick with head ache and pain in back. Lat 13° 08' N Long 156° 36'

Remarks for Friday Nov 18th

This day commences with strong winds from Eastward and clear weather middle the same with heavy squalls and rain last strong winds and clear no squalls part the time carrying all sail and part topgallantails in watch employed in drawing yarns and brading sinnet and several other small jobs. Fly Thomas and cook still of duty sick and a man by the name of James gone of duty sick with bad disorder. Lat 11° 32' N Long 156° 32'

Remarks for Saturday Nov 19th

This day commences with strong winds from Eastward steering S E by S our coarse all sail set middle and last the same had some two or three squalls in the 24 hours employed in knotting yarns and brading sinnet all the sick about the same. Lat 9° 46' N Long 156° 16'

Remarks for Sunday Nov 20th

This day commences with heavy winds and squaw from eastward heading S E by the wind took in topgallantails one reef in foretopail and brunt of the gib. Middle wind increased double reefed the topsails last a squall broke out 1 reef from m topsail being Sunday no employment the sick a little better. Lat 7° 34' N Long

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Remarks for Monday Nov 21st

This day commences with strong winds from eastward and cloudy weather with rain in squalls carrying double reef fore and single reef main topsail and main sail heading S E by S our coarse middle squally with heavy rain last cleared up with strong winds heading S E by the wind employed in breaking out for water and making fly gib boom. Lat 6° 09' N Long 155° 10'

Remarks for Tuesday Nov 22

This day commences with strong winds from Eastward heading S E by S with pleasant weather carrying main topgallant middle and last weather moderate made all sail wind heading the ship off to S employed in painting fly gib boom overhauling fly gib rigging and taring it set up main stay broke out sail boom overhauled the sail to see they were not damaging shoved them back all the sick is now well and on duty except the cook he is no better he says his complaint is an old affair by falling down the storage ladder it has brought it on again. Lat 4° 10' N Long 155° 11'

Remarks for Wednesday Nov 23rd

This day commences with moderate winds and weather from Eastward ship heading S by W by the wind middle fine weather and light winds last calm with rain squalls employed in setting up rigging and mending fly gib Thomas of duty again sick with dry head and complaints of palpitation of the heart cook no better. Lat 3° 15' N Long from

Remarks for Thursday Nov 24

This day commences with light winds and calms with rain squall from the eastward middle light winds and clear last cloudy with fresh breezes accompanied with rain squalls heading from S E by S to S by W employed in setting up fore rigging repairing fly gib and some other small jobs in the Wick about the same. Lat 2° 05' N Long 155° 40'

Remarks for Friday Nov 25th

This day commences with strong winds from the eastward and cloudy heading S by W by the wind middle fresh breezes and clear last the same all sail set heading S by W employed in setting up mizen topmast rigging brading fore topmast stay sail making searing stuff pulling off spring yarn the sick some better. Lat 00° 12' N Long 155° 16'
