Remarks for Saturday Nov 26th

This day commences with fresh breezes from SE by E with pleasant weather ship heading S by E by the wind middle wind hauled more easterly heading S by E last the same going a little free employed at work on riggin sick about the same Lat 4° 47' S Long 156° 00' W

Remarks for Sunday Nov 28th

This day commences with strong winds from east steering S by E some free all sail set middle the same last wind more moderate and very pleasant weather saw a ship standing to the northward supposed her to be cruising as she had no fore or main top gallant gail set saw two fin back whales and some large sea birds being Sunday no unnecessary work doing the two sick men no better Lat 4° 11' S Long 155° 47' W

Remarks for Monday Nov 29th

This day commences with pleasant winds from E and beautiful weather steering S by E all sail set middle and last the same steering S employed in sending out fly gill boom mending fly gill and some other small jobs about some purposes Lat 6° 32' S Long 156° 13' West

Remarks for Tuesday Nov 30th

This day commences with fresh breezes from SE and pleasant weather steering S by the wind all sail set middle light and calms from N E ship going of 6 points free last cloudy with rain wind freshened set foremast steering sail employed setting up main riggin and seeping it off and other jobs about riggin Thomas much better he came on duty again today

cook about the same no Lat or Long this day being cloudy

Remarks for Wednesday Dec 1st

This day commences with pleasant breezes from about N E with cloudy weather with some rain steering south free with S by E steering sail set middle the same last wind hauled more northerly watch employed on the riggin broke out two bl meat all hands able for duty kept firm and the cooks they do not get any better saw nothing this day Lat 9° 40' S Long 156° 30' W by chron bent the fly gill

Bound on a whaling voyage to the north Pacific

Remarks for Thursday Dec 2nd

This day commences with pleasant winds and weather from North steering S all sail set square yards middle wind came NNE shifted over to M Studingsail last the same with very hot weather employed in sending down f topsail and repairing it and bent it again broke out the meat cask cleaned it and put it back clewed up the M topsail and repaired it some on the yard firm and took about the same Lat 11° 16' S Long by chron 156° 38'

Remarks for Friday Dec 3rd

This day commences with light wind from NNE and calm with very hot pleasant weather steering S all sail set middle wind hauled N last batten winds with rain squalls employed in small jobs of different kinds sick no better Lat 12° 01' N Long

Remarks for Saturday Dec 4th

This day commences with light winds with rain squalls and calms hauled up the courses and settled down to J sail and let her lay for a breeze middle the same had one very heavy rain squall last light batten winds and calms saw 4 sail 4 points on our lee standing northward employed in repairing riggin and fitting fly gill with invalids the same

Remarks for Sunday Dec 5th

This day commences with light batten winds and rain squalls steering S when we had any wind middle light breeze from eastward steering S by E last strong breeze and quite pleasant with rain squalls at intervals a sail in sight to leeward saw a fin back whale being Sunday no employment sick no better

Lat 13° 34' S Long by chron 157° 33' Linn 157° 22'

Remarks for Monday Dec 6th

This day commences with pleasant breezes from eastward steering S by W our coarse middle heavy squalls of wind and rain and lightning clewed down to J sails and took in fly gill east most pleasant set all sail again employed in repairing riggin

Lat 15° 15' S Long 158° 30' Linn 157° 16'

Remarks for Tuesday Dec 7th

This day commences with fresh winds from ESE and pleasant weather steering S by W our coarse middle wind hauled more easterly shifted up S by E last the same employed on riggin and broke out for flour molasses mugs soap &c
