Remarks for Thursday Jan 27th

This day commences with light winds from S.W. and pleasant weather steering N.E. by E. all sail set middle and last the same employed in finding in fly get repairing it and bending it again loaded some white soap dinner for bucketing casks for rafting saw nothing but some birds

Lat 41° 05' S Long 82° 19' West

Remarks for Friday Jan 28th

This day commences with fine weather and wether from S.W. steering N.E. by E. all sail out middle and last strong winds and flying clouds saw several fin backs whales employed picking Ocum and broke out meat boiled the porpoise blubber we had on hand it made us about 3 gals oil

Lat 40° 00' S Long 79° 13' West

Remarks for Saturday Jan 29th

This day commences with strong winds from S.W. and pleasant weather steering N.E. by E. all sail set middle and last steer N.E. employed in different jobs got the anchor gear up and overhauled it

Lat 38° 44' S Long 76° 06' West

Remarks for Sunday Jan 30th

This day commences with fresh winds from S.E. and good weather steer N.E. by E. all sail set middle and last strong winds with flying clouds altered our course to N. by E. by E. pointing off for the port of Valparaiso it bearing from us this day is N.E. by N. distance 23 1/2 miles saw two ships steering in the E. toward supposed them to be sperm whale cruizers nothing doing this day being Sunday saw a number of fin backs got a runner over and found the log

Lat 36° 39' S

Remarks for Monday Jan 31th

This day commences with strong winds from S.E. and clear weather steering N. by E. by E. carrying all sail nearly before the wind middle and last the same employed getting ready for coming to anchor 8 O'clock A.M. got a runner over by the Sun and Moon and found the Log 73° 11' N by Sun by Chro. 73° 18' at 3 O'clock got an Ober and by Chro 72° 47' West

Commander bound to Valparaiso to fit for Oct

Remarks for Tuesday Feb 1st

This day commences with very strong winds from S.E. and clear weather steering N.E. with topsails out expecting to raise land every hour but it shut in dark and no land in sight the horizon being hazy could not see very far middle the same last raised land ahead ran in to it and found the ship to the Southern of the port of Valparaiso about 18 miles nothing much doing but looking out for land

Lat 33° 18' S Long

Remarks for Wednesday Feb 2nd

This day commences with fine wind from southeast and clear weather steered down the coast and came of the port of Valparaiso about 9 O'clock P.M. was boarded by the customs but it died away calm and we lay becalmed until 13 O'clock ~~we~~ got a light breeze ran in the harbor and came to anchor in 35 fathoms water at 8 O'clock furled sails cleared up decks and washed ship out side and in cap't went on shore and sent off some fresh beef and vegetables

Remarks for Thursday Feb 3rd

Laying in the port of Valparaiso with fine weather and light winds employed in breaking out oil from main hatch took out about 125 bl on deck and coopered it

Remarks for Friday Feb 4th

This day lying in the port of Valparaiso with fine weather and strong winds busy breaking out and coopering oil took on shore the cork we shipped at Mohe and Jim and put them in the hospital sick

Remarks for Saturday Feb 5th

Laying in the port of Valparaiso fine weather and light winds first part the day and fresh the last rafted 16 casks of sperm oil and sent it ashore some the cap't had sold here

Remarks for Sunday Feb 6th

Lay in the port of Valparaiso with fine weather and light winds all hands lying idle waiting to take on shore some oil Later part I then board waited ashore on liberty

Remarks for Monday Feb 7th

Laying in port of Valparaiso with fine weather and light winds I then board waited ashore I then board waited came aboard all but one man to exchange two men that. While their passage from home also discharged the Mate fluted the 2nd and third mate to M. M. and 2nd Mate. Employed breaking out oil and coopering it
