strong breeze from N.W. S. steering S. Latter part much
the same carrying all prudent sail Carpenter
getting better Marna very bad the others no change
for the better Lat 46th 49

Remarks for Monday Oct 24th

Commenced with strong breeze from N.W. S. steering East
With Main S.G. sail out watch employed in ordinary
ship's duty At 12 o'clock and 30 minutes George Randolph
A Tharada died with the consumption 3 pm double reefed
the F.T. sail and took in M.T.G. sail 4 pm buried George
6 pm took in M. sail and single reefed the M. T. sail.

July Middle part more moderate turned the
reefs out of the F sails and set M. sail and M.T.G. sail
Latter part strong breeze steering S. all sail out in sails

A gill beam invalids about the same George & Mary
sick Lat 46th 20 Long 177-23 East

Remarks for Thursday Oct 27th

Commenced with moderate breeze from N.W. S. heading
S. and S.E. S. watch employed in sitting the rigging for
The jib boom cooper getting the 8 pm 5 pm and hauled
to S.W. S. steering by the wind took black aboard 7 pm
strong breeze took in M.T.G. sail 8 pm double reefed
the F.T. sail and furled the M. sail Middle part

Strong gale from S.W. S. wore ship heading North in
F.T. sail close reefed the M.T. sail and reefed the F.T. sail
Latter part much the same lying under short sail 11 am
A few stores the garys aboard as much garys aboard

Invalids much the same

Remarks for Sunday Oct 30th

Commenced with light breeze from S.E. S. steering by the wind
Shook black aboard all sail out watch employed sitting out
Meat and starting some flour 6 pm wind S.E. heading S.W. S.
Middle part strong breeze from S.E. heading S.W. S. Latter part
Wind increases took in M.T.G. sail double reefed F.T. sail invalids
much the same
