Middle part more moderate turned the reef out of the J. T. sail and hauled S. by E. Heading East Latten part wind hauled to West Starling S. by E. with all sail out rainy foggy weather all hands on duty for a while but mites. Mate very fat with the Rheumatism

Remarks for Friday Nov 11th

Commenced with light breeze from West and North Starling S. by E. with all necessary sail out rainy weather watch employed in ordinary ship's duty saw a shoat of black fish. Middle part much the same. Latten part

Light huffling winds from North and West. Mites no better. Mate about the same. Lat 46° 38' - 15 Lon 154° 58' - 35

Remarks for Sat Nov 12th

Commenced with light breeze from North and West Starling S. by E. with all sail out watch employed in ordinary ship's duty. Middle part much the same. Latten part wind S. by E. Starling by the wind heading S. by E. and wind hauled to N. by E. Set Topmast standing sail standing course S. by E. Mate no better. Mites much the same. Lat 46° 38' - 30 Lon 155° - 38

Remarks for Sunday Nov 13th

Commenced with light breeze from West Starling S. by E. with all sail out watch employed heading East and getting out J. T. sail without the one sheet and bent another one. Middle part calm. Latten part light breeze from S. by E. heading S. by E. 10 am fresh breeze from S. by E. heading S. by E. Mate no better. Mites about the same. Lat 46° 38' - 53

Remarks for Monday Nov 14th

Commenced with strong breeze from S. E. heading S. by E. took in jib and the J. T. sail and double reefed. The J. T. sails pulled up the J. T. sail 4 pm wind S. by E. Wave ship heading East rainy. Middle part wind shifted to S. by E. made sail Starling S. by E. Latten part strong breeze from N. by E. set J. T. the latten sail. Adams and watch of duty sick. Mites much the same. Mate some better. Lat 46° 38' - 54 Lon 154° - 45

Remarks for Tuesday Nov 15th

Commenced with strong breeze from West Starling S. by E. with all sail out watch employed in various jobs about the ship washed the waist board and put beer on the cranes. Middle part wind S. by E. Latten part light breeze from N. by E. Starling S. by E. watch employed

Getting home out of J. T. hole to escape the getting some from between decks to dry in rats much the same. Mate still continues about the same. Lat 46° 38' - 40 Lon 154° - 19

Remarks for Wednesday 16th

Commenced with light breeze from N. by E. Starling S. by E. with all sail out watch employed washing. Bore 8 pm light air from North and West. Middle part calm. Latten part light breeze from S. by E. heading S. by E. 11 am wind S. by E. Tacked ship heading S. by E. employed washing home. Adams on duty. Mites and black much the same. Mate a little better.

Remarks for Thursday Nov 17th

Commenced with light huffling winds from North and East heading S. by E. S. by E. watch employed washing. Middle part calm. Latten part light breeze from S. by E. Starling by the wind heading S. by E. watch employed. Washing home. Adams about the same. Lat 46° 38' - 09 Lon 154° - 40

Remarks for Friday Nov 18th

Commenced with light breeze from S. by E. heading S. by E. watch employed washing. Bore started one pipe of water out of fore hold. Middle part much the same. Latten part broke out the bore in the after hold also some beer and molasses in one hold no better. One of the hands took some latten taken this morning searched for them without success in the fore hold.
