Commenced with light breeze from S.W. Steering S. by E. The wind stand back about watch employed washing fore Bone Middle part and sails latter part wind head To West Steering S. watch employed washing fore No change in the invalids for the better Lat by Obs 30-53

Remarks for Sunday Nov 20th

Commenced with light breeze from N.W. Steering S. with all sail out watch employed washing fore 6 pm set S.W. Steering sail Middle part much the same Latter part wind hauled to S.W. heading S. by E Took in Studding sail invalids much the same

Remarks for Monday Nov 21st

Commenced with light breeze from S.W. heading S. by E. Employed drying fore 6 pm strong breeze from N.W. Steering S. with frequent squalls Middle part wind hauled To N.W. Steering S. by E Took in Studding sail Latter part strong breeze from N.W. Steering S. employed washing fore Invalids much the same Took a Lunar Obs and found The Longitude by Lunar 180-52 by Obs 151-17

Remarks for Tuesday Nov 22^d

Commenced with strong breeze from N. Steering S. by W. With all sail out watch employed in various jobs About the ship 4 pm Steering S. by W. Middle part much the same Latter part wind N.W. Steering S. by W. employed washing Ship inside One ship in sight got a Lunar Obs. and found The Longitude by Lunar 152-17 by Obs 152-30 Lat 25-26 Invalids about the same

Remarks for Wednesday Nov 23^d

Commenced with strong breeze from N.W. Steering S. by W. With all sail out all hands employed washing ship Inside 1 pm spoke ship Republic of Bremen Capt Austin 19 or this season 5 pm finished washing fore N.W. Steering S. by W. Took in Studding sail to look side Middle part much the same Latter part light breeze From N.W. Steering S. by W. watch employed washing Ship outside started some water Natick a little better The other invalids much the same

Remarks for Thursday Nov 24th

Commenced with light breeze from S.W. Steering S. by E. With all sail out watch employed washing ship outside Middle part much the same Latter part wind S. Steering S. by E. finished washing ship outside Lat by Obs 28-38 Outer field of ship with the others much the same Long by Obs 154-24

Remarks for Friday Nov 25th

Commenced with fresh breeze from S. Steering S. by E. With all sail out watch employed in various jobs about the ship 6 pm took in S.W. Steering S. by E. Took in M. T. S. S. Hail wind S.W. Middle part much the same Latter part same sea the East end of house leaning S. by E. Took in for the passage from 7 till noon Light baffling winds and calms Steering W. by N. 2 ships in sight bearing in invalids much the same Got the anchors of the bows and heist the chains

Remarks for Saturday Nov 26th

Commenced with light baffling winds from East Steering W. by N. and S. through the passage 3 pm Wind hauled to E. bearing up to the anchorage Saw one ship land and out Middle part much the same Latter part light breeze from S. bearing up to the Anchorage 2 other ships bearing up 7 pm Capt went ashore

Remarks for Sunday Nov 27th

Commenced with light breeze from S. bearing up to the anchorage 2 pm Capt came aboard 4 pm came two for house boards in 15 fathoms water Landed Anchor Ahead Capt went ashore again Middle part strong breeze from S. and rain Latter part strong breeze and thunder showers Stearboard watch on liberty

Remarks for Monday Nov 28th

Commenced with light breeze from North lying at anchor Stearboard watch on liberty 4 of them came off the rest stuffed ashore Cook and Peter got put in the port Latter part the rest of the watch came off took the Cook and Peter out of the Port and sent them aboard All hands employed setting up 4 st. sheets and drying Bone sent the Natick the Regent to the Hospital And Miles to the Doctor
