Common with strong breeze from S.E., steering N.N.E.  
With all necessary sail out water rapidly employed  
about the ship Towed a Burying to Middle part with  
The same latter part set F. & H. holding sail lower and  
Main Rig & Mast sail three Royal Tack a line off to starboard 39-04  
Lon by Chron 39-41  
Lat by Obs 29-46

Remarks for Friday March 24<sup>th</sup>

Commerce with strong breeze from S.E., clearing N.N.E.  
 With all sail out and good weather water employed in  
 clearing ships duty 6 for wind S.E. Middle part lightening variable  
 latter part strong breeze S.E. clearing N.N.E. Lat 6<sup>th</sup> 27-25  
 Long 110<sup>th</sup> 39-03

Remarks for Saturday March 25<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with strong breeze from S.E. Hauling N. N. W. &  
W. & sail out. Hauls tails and lot employed about the rigging  
of Hauling N. & N. W. and later part much the same

Remarks for Tuesday March 28<sup>th</sup>

Commerce with light breeze from S.W., strong by the wind  
Heaving N. and N.W., with employed making netting fluff  
Found the Boatwain's gun and Cooper making a new one  
While fast tacked ship heaving S.W. to N.W. latter  
Part strong breeze from N.W. heaving E. & back in N. short  
Tide and gentle breeze the T. Edits squally and rainy

Remarks for Wednesday March 29<sup>th</sup>

Commerces with strong trade from N.E. heading N.W.  
Doubt needed the T. Tails with heavy squalls and rain  
before back in F. T. Tail heading S. Middle part heavy squalls.  
And rain 3 am heavy squall faded the Fire Tail set T. Taper  
And close up the M. T. Tail 7 am more moderate set F. Tail  
And F. T. Tail turned the reefers out of M. T. Tail 1st 4th 21-58

Remarks for Thursday March 30<sup>th</sup>

Common as with light breeze and some small flying by.  
The used heading S. N. E. and N. E. by E. with employed in the  
Duty. 7 pm light air from N. N. W. Steady N. E. by N. Moderate  
North calm. Light part calm unbrd. the M. Light and steady.  
Down to repair frequent showers Cooper at work on the top.

Remarks for Friday March 31<sup>st</sup>

Commerce with calm water employed getting in the  
Fishing jig soon 3 pm light breeze from S.W. Steaming  
N. by N. Set Studding sails Middle part calm latter part  
Set in Sea room and took of the cap Cooper putting  
The hoaps on the shore one remaining near ship  
Lat 40 20-56  
Long 66-40 39-25

Remarks for Saturday Apr 7<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with light air from S. E. M. Steaming  
N. by E. with all sail out water employed in ship
