

March the 24 got ready for sea on the 28
6 blacks left the ship which detained us 19 days
to get men

April the 19 got all on board at put to sea
passed between the Wharves and Wari or steered to the
Northward

April the 28 in Lat. 28-30 Long 156 30 saw
Sperm Whale going quick to the Westward

from the 28 of April to the 4 of June saw nothing
remarkable except a few hump backs this day
spoke with the John Adams of Hartford

June the 4 saw a school of Whales got a large one
to 9 saw a large whale going to the Westward

the 10 saw a school and got 3 small whales

the 11 saw a number of schools struck a large
whale from the bow from one and passed the line
from the other one going to the Southward the other

to the Northward the one going to the South died
and was took it alongside on the 14 saw the dead

Whale near the line and 50 lbs of oil from it
these Whales were got between the Lat of 33 and 34

Long 144 and 142 West

From the 14 of June saw nothing remarkable in all

the 6 of July when we spoke the ship Peragon
saw a large whale and got it Long 146 30 S

which determined our going for home

The following is a few remarks
on our passage



July 13 made sail with the wind at ESE steered
SE from the 16th to the 23 strong breezes and equally

from East to NE on the 24 in Lat 19 27 Long 133 10

had a strong gale at NE here too under the mainmast
sent down the top gallant rigging and took in the boats

the 25 more moderate the 26 27 and 28 strong trade
from the NE on the 29 in Lat 13 00 Long 130 30 S

at 8 PM came on to blow a heavy gale from North
to NE the 29 more moderate wind at ESE steered

SE 30 00 ended the month with Light breeze and rain
from the Eastward

August the 1st 1824 in Lat 9 53 N Long 130 40 S

Light breeze Calm equally and rain and so on to the
8 in Lat 6 26 Long 129 00 saw a school of Whales part

off and got 2 of 12 lbs each

Aug 12 in Lat 4 16 S Long 128 00 saw a school of Whales
and got one here by got the SE trade wind on the 16

crossed the line in Long 130 46 M found a strong current
setting to the Westward wind veering from SE to East in

Lat 7 00 S Long 133 S found the current setting more
to the Southward and running more moderate

From the 16th to the 29 of August fine pleasant
weather in Lat 15 S saw a great many birds

after passing the Lat of 19 S Long 129 10 S the wind
veering more to the Northward so the steaming sails

August the 31st in Lat 24 50 S Long 120 00 the wind
changed suddenly to the Southward with plenty of

rain on the 31st saw Pitt Cairn's Island bearing
North by East Distance 20 miles wind at SE

Sept 1 the Slave bearing South the wind at SE it is
still a boat came from the shore with 11 of the natives

in it on the 2nd and 3rd got wood and grass and on the 4th
fell aboard to the Eastward wind at SE
