

Brig Frances, A. Barstow.
Sept 6th

Light breeze from the Westward.
Ship working to the S.W. along the
edge of loose scattering ice.
one ship in sight. some snow.

Sept 7th
Moderate breeze from the East.
Ship working to the Westward and
latter part steering N by West.

Sept 8th
Moderate from the S.E.
Ship working to the W. & S.W.
by points of ice. saw BK
"Josephine" chasing. no success
soon after spoke her, also
BK "Sea Breeze"

Sept 9th
Light S.E. winds. ship working
to the S. & S.W. by points of
ice. weather thick & raining
six ships in sight

Sept 10th
Moderate breeze from the N.E.
with some fog. ship working to
the Westward by the ice.
Four "ships" in sight.
At dark, spoke BK "Northern Light"
"Simmons" master from "Kodiak" &
"Behring" Sea with "Elmer" "Right"
"Whales"

Sept 11th
Moderate breeze from the East-
with thick fog. ship lying off
and on over the pack ice.
six vessels in sight

Sept 12th

Moderate breeze from the N.N.E.
with plenty of fog.
Ship lying off & on the ice.
Spoke BK "Horatio" "Winslow"
Master. from "Behring Sea" last
with two "Right Whales"
Reports the "Josephine" took a
"Bowhead" on the tenth

Sept 13th
Blowing a moderate gale from N.N.E.
Ship lying under the lee of the ice
in company with the fleet, eight
vessels, at 12 M, saw a "Bowhead"
one rising. did not lower.
rather snowy & thick. lost run
of him.

Sept 14th
Moderate from the N.E.
Ship beating to the windward
in company with the fleet.
during the day saw three
ships chasing. no success.
whales going quick to the S.W.
at dark fifteen ships in sight.

Sept 15th
Light breeze from the N.E. & E.
Ship cruising. Spoke BK "John &
"Winthrop". "Lucky" "Master" two "Right"
"Whales". Saw her chasing soon
after also the "Alice Knowles" &
"Bonanza" with no success.

Sept 16th
Calms & light variable. Cruising
Spoke the "Bonanza". "Winthrop"
"Master" & "Herald" Island in
sight to the S.W. about
forty five miles
