about three knots. one man off duty
named George Rosa.

April 7.

Hands at various jobs wind strong
from the South came through
the day N.W. by N. some

April 8.

Hands at ships duty. course N.W.
Ship heading N.W. at noon and
steamed for South East - and foggy
with slight N.W. during the remainder
of the day. passed through the fog
Pt. 172 Pass did not see the land.

April 9.

Hands at ships duty. ~~at 10 A.M. the fog~~
the Pt. Pass. thick fog until rain
P.M. cleared up a little but did
not see any land N.W. by N.

April 10.

Hands at ships duty calm at noon
wind sprang up from the South
and remained so until dark. veered
to S.W. all night - course N.W. by N.
