Wednesday May 4 1892.

A.M. Brig under top sails working
to the S.E. two vessels in sight -
P.M. under all sail wind S.E.

Lat Long

Thursday May 5. 1892.

Brig working to the S.E. three ships in
sight. wind S.W. saw a Bowhead
in the ice snows.

Friday May 6. 1892.

Bamed the Alci Rovers in wind South
working to the eastward, all well.

Saturday May 7. 1892.

Four ships in sight. Louping about
the ice. P.M. lowered for Bowhead.
S. B. darted twice but did not fasten
his chance snows.

Sunday May 8. 1892

A.M. S. B. struck and got a whale
took him along side and took his
head. Eleven foot Bows, all well.

Monday May 9 1892

Laying about under short sail
three ships in sight - wind N.E.

Tuesday May 10 1892

Laying about the ice under short sail
three ships in sight - one of them the
Sh. Belvedere, run to the eastward,
Barked out from Bears & Coffee, and struck
the hole over.

Wednesday May 11. 1892.

Working ship to the eastward and
further from the S.E. & E. one strain sight.
P.M. three ships in sight - to the westward

Thursday May 12 1892.

Hands at ship duty, working to the
eastward, three ships in sight. wind S.
Lat 62° 54' N. Long 175° 10' W

Friday May 13 1892.

A.M. blowing hard from the E.N.E.
Brig under short sail. P.M. four sails
in sight - working to the eastward
at dark moderated. made sail.
Lat 62° 44' N Long 174° 30'

Saturday May 14 1892

A.M. ship under all sail. weather
thick with snow. "all well"
Lat 63° 12' Long 173° 50'

Sunday May 15 1892

A.M. St Lawrence Island in sight - and
one strain. P.M. hove to under short
sail Island 18 miles off. two ships one
schooner & a Bark in sight -
Lat 63° 15' Long 172° 11'
