

Remarks onboard F. A. Barlow

Monday May 16 1892

A.M. one ship to schooner & Bark in sight.
P.M. gained the Ross. saw a devil
fish south shore. Laying a boat
in the ice.

Tuesday May 17 1892.

"All Well" ship under short sail
Laying about in the ice two sail
in sight.

No Obs.

Wednesday May 18 1892,

Gained the schooner. Capt at work
on cutting Stage Island & north shore
in sight. fog. No Obs.

Thursday May 19 1892,

Water Gained Alice Knobel & Schooner
fog. vessel lying about in the
ice. No Obs.

Friday May 20 1892.

Hands at ship's duty. worked ship to
the north some Main Land in sight -
45 miles off. Island bears East. 20 miles.

Saturday May 21 1892

Worked to the N.W. about 10 miles.
wind N.E. two ships in sight -
devil fish. shot a seal North shore
in sight. all well,
Lat. Long.

Sunday May 22 1892

Kept off to the South. bound to the
westward working through ice with
the A. Knobel & Ross. No Obs.

Monday May 23 1892.

Running to the South & west. at noon
hauled to the N.W. latter part
working to the Northward & westward
No Obs.

Tuesday May 24 1892,

Working to the N.W. under all sail
Wind N.W.W. in company with 15 vessels
Lat. 62.30. Long 172.23.

Wednesday May 25 1892

A.M. still working ship. to the N.W.
P.M. calm
Lat 63.13. Long 172.53.

Thursday May 26 1892.

P.M. in making off more to the
westward wind sprang up from the
South P.M. thick with snow
at six o'clock calm. at nine P.M.
wind breezed up from the North -
how to aback thick snow.
two ships in sight.

Lat 63.45-N. Long 173.26.
