Thursday July 28 1892.
A m weather good. caught a few
cod fish coming. have not seen a
wight whale since leaving Alaska.
P m weather fine light air from the west.

Friday July 29 1892
Light winds & calm caught a few cod.
work to the S.W. all well.

Lat 58:34. Long 166:45.

Saturday July 30, 1892
A m saw two "Man of War" bound to
the northwest light winds & calm.
P m light wind from the eastward

Lat 58:00. Long 166:34.

Sunday July 31 1892.
Smart breeze from the eastward
gained the Bks Alaska & Warden
all well.

Monday Aug 1 1892.
A m one Bark in sight working the
Bay to the eastward
P m gained the "Alaska". four ships
in sight

Weather foggy & calm working
to the north all well.

Friday Aug 5 1892
Weather fine six vessels in sight -
the English Man of War Melrose
spoke us saw several finbacks.

Saturday Aug 6 1892
Hands busy at various jobs.
four ships in sight - finbacks.
Lat 59:17. Long 170:34 W.

Sunday Aug 7, 1892.
Weather fine, plenty of finbacks about.
strong breeze from the N.W.
Lat 59:10. Long 170:26.

Monday Aug 8. 1892.
A m fog. P m saw six vessels. gained
the Sea Ranger. spoke Jal Allen & La Vigne
Winds S.W.
Lat 59:9 Long 170:23 W
