

Remarks on board Brig F. A. Barston
Sat. Aug. 27th 1892

Commences with moderate wind from S.W. with some fog. At 2 A.M. hove up anchor and stood off shore at 12 M. Anchored again. Latter part wind the same.

Sunday Aug. 28

Commences with moderate breeze from S. At 7 P.M. hove up anchor and stood in closer to the point and let go again. Hove off some new rigging to day. S. ends.

Mon. Aug. 29th

This day commences with a strong S.W. wind. At 6.30 A.M. started our Port cable, ^{with hauling up} got under weigh, and anchored under the lee of the point. Latter part wind moderating.

Tues. Aug. 30th

^{got under weigh at 2 A.M.} Commences with light breeze from N.E. At 4.30 A.M. grappled for anchor and hauled it up, and saved it. At 8 A.M. made sail and stood to the S.W. Employed receiving new running rigging. Latter part wind hauling to S.E. at 10 P.M. raised and scattered ice, to S.W. of us. S. ends.

Wed. Aug. 31st

Commences with light breeze from East working to the S.W. 3 Whalers in sight took anchors in the bows and started cable. Latter part wind hauling to S.W.

Sept. 1st 1892

Commences with light air from S.E. Latter part breezing up from same quarter. Triton and W. Baylies in company, steering to the S.W.

Sept 2nd

Strong breeze and heavy squalls from S.E. Latter part wind moderating. 4 Whalers in sight.

Sat. Sept 3rd

Reminder Begins with light wind from North. W. Baylies Hove some strips of ice in the N.W. 8 Whalers in sight. Steering W.S.W. Reminder jammed Reminder, who reports that 1 Bk. 1 Bounding 1 Bullow chased a bowhead, Aug 29.

Sun. Sept 4th

Bowhead Commences with good breeze from the Westward with heavy snow squalls. At 3 P.M. raised a Bowhead but he was so far to windward that we did not lower. Afterward saw the Reminder, chasing the same whale, but without success. 5 ships in sight.

Mon. Sept. 5th

A. Barker Strong W. and S. winds, with plenty of snow squalls, Brig working to westward. Latter part weather moderating.
