 and left us at Whistling buoy
 at 11.30 a.m. lite breeze from N.W.
 steering W.S.W. moderate breeze

Mon March 13

This day being with calm and later
 being with wind from S.E. steering
 S.W.W. and crew employ ship duty

Tue March 14

This day being with wrain squall wind from
 S.S.E. heading S.W. and later of the day wind
 hall to W.S.W. heading S and crew employ
 ship duty and found our pall bit broke
 so we can't work our wingles

Wed March 15

This day beginning with wrain squalls and
 steering S.W. wind W.N.W. and later
 part of the day calm hands employed
 ship duty

Thu March 16

This day being with lite breeze from S.W.
 heading W.N.W. and have been the
 work at our pall bit and is in the day

Fri March 17

This day being with wind from S.S.W.
 heading W and hands employed
 in setting up rigging

This day beginning with wind from S.S.W.
 and at four P.M. wind hall to W.S.W.
 heading S on starb tack and raining

Sun March 19

This day beginning with rain wind from
 N.E. and steering S.W. S and at three
 P.M. wind hall to S heading W.S.W.
 on the port tack and fresh breeze

Mon March 20

This being with strong breeze from
 W.S.W. heading S on port tack
 under short sail

Tue March 21

This day beginning with strong breeze
 from W.N.W. steering S.W. and
 later part of the day wind lite
 and one ship in site

Wed March 22

This day beginning with wrain squalls
 wind from S.W. and later part wind
 hall to W.N.W. heading S.W. on
 the starb tack and employed ship duty

Thu March 23

This day beginning with rain and wind
 from W.S.W. on the wind starb tack
 hands employed ship duty

Fri March 24

This day beginning with rain squalls
 wind from W.S.W. heading W.S.W.
 and later part foggy hands employed
 ship duty
