

Remarks on Ward Brig L. A. Boston

Wen Jun 7

day commences with lite breas from NE and thick fog middle part clear and last part wind hall to N W and four sails in site all working to N at four P M thick fog a gale and ice quite thick and lots of young ice

Thu Jun 8

commences with wind from N W by W and to N W and N threw heavy flows of ice and first part day four sails in site and last part one at six P M rais land to N of us

Fri Jun 9

commences with wind from N W by W and spreading N and middle part of the day wind did out calm and still calm and four sails in site and land about twelve miles off and shakel our chains on and being in clear water to day and one native boat came along side

Sat Jun 10

commences with calm and last part lite breas from W N W and working to N W and being off Cape Arings and ice in site to S W of us and some native boats came along side

Sun Jun 11

commences with calm and middle part lite breas from S W tearing E S E along the land and ice off shore of us and three sails in site

Mon Jun 12

being with wind from W and steering along the land at three P Manker at anchor pint and to ship lay at pint and saw a steamer and saw to other ship under way and seal native boats along side and last part thick fog

Tues Jun 13

laying to anchor at the pint lite breas from N N E and thick by spells and saw three steamers to at anchor at pint and ice drifting round and seal native boats came along side

Wen Jun 14

commences with lite breas from N and thick fog and last part wind hall to S and rain and to vessels lay at pint

Thu Jun 15

commences with thick fog wind from S S W blowing strong at six A M got under way heading S E starb tack last part heading N W port tack and clear by spells and gamed bark to on three sails in site
