

Remarks on Board Brig F. A. Barton

Wed. July 5
commences with little breeze from south and got under way and working to N and middle part calm and anchor at five P M for a breeze from N and got under way again

Thu. July 6
commences with wind from S E and first part steering W N W at one steering N and part dimensions and thick and warm and to sails in site first part of day

Fri. July 7
commences with wind from S E and thick fog and rain and steering N and middle part of the after-noon clear off a little and saw three ships at five P M we left to heading S W on port tack under short sail

Sat. July 8
commences with thick fog and wind S E and working to S and last part calm and clear off so you could see three miles and saw to sails and ice and lost a boat and tow way from the ice

Sun. July 9
commences with wind from N W and ran heading S first part of the day middle part wind hall to E S E heading N E land in site head and to ships in site

Mon. July 10
commences with little breeze from N and thick fog at twelve clear off heading E N E and raised land head and to ships and last part strong breeze and ice all along the land and saw several ships to anchor at point hope at seven P M heading to N and W

Tues. July 11
commences with strong breeze from N W and first part fog and rain and point hope in site at six A M but could get with these seven or eight miles of it on count of so much ice and several ships in site and four steamers in site first part of the day and to of them anchor at the point

Weds. July 12
being with strong breeze from N and working to N under storm sails and plenty of ice to N of us and several ships in site all working the same

Thu. July 13
commences with strong breeze from N and working to north and ice to north of us and five ships in site and all working the same at four P M sheet in thick fog and storm sails set
