

Remarkson Brig F. A. Baston

Fri July 14
being with wind from N. E. and
heaving E. N. E. on port tack and
come to plenty ice and wear ship
heaving N. W. and laying back on
starb tack and thick fog at
twelve brass fore and working
to north and spork bark hunter
and northern light and to others
ships in site

Sat July 15
commences with wind from N and
thick fog and ice to N. E. of us and
working to N and saw fine ships
and lite bears and all still set

Sun July 16
commences with thick fog wind
veering from N. N. W. to N. N. E. and
on port tack heading to E. all day
seven P. M. clear off and saw to ship
and few cakes of ice

Mon July 17
being with wind from N. at five
A. M. rais pint hope head at seven
A. M. anchor at the south side of pint
and plenty of ice round at four
P. M. calm and plenty of ice and
we got under way but we drag all
around with the ice and anchor
right off the pint thick fog

Tues July 18
commences with wind from E. and
thick fog and laying to anks to
north of the pint at twelve clear
off and got under way and steering
north at six P. M. thick fog and calm
drop anchor and some ice around
and middle part saw fine ships

Wen July 19
commences with wind from E. and
rain and got under way at twelve
being off cape Lisben and wind
hall to south west and plenty of ice
it made off from cape about west
fifteen miles at three P. M. calm
at fine lite bears from N. heading
W. and saw to sails

Thu July 20
commences with thick and rain and
wind from N. E. and working to
N. E. at seven A. M. spork steamer
navark and last part clear off
a little and spork bark all ice nowls
saw to scooners and saw cape
Lisben bearing S. b. E.

Fri July 21
commences with strong bears from
N. N. E. and fog and first part
the day heading N. W. and middle
part clear off little and wore ship
heading E. under storm sails and
bark all ice knowles in site and
saw few cakes of ice
