

Remarks on Board Brig F A Boston

Sat July 22

commences with calm and fog by spells at seven P M. lite breas from N steering S E and can see about four miles by spells

Sun July 23

commences with calm and thick fog at seven A M anchor at nine clear off and saw land and to ships and to scooners lite breas from S W steering S E at four P M calm anchor again off breast the coal mivels but some wase off shore and ice in shore of us and gained the topsail scooner

Mon July 24

commences with calm at ten A M got lite breas from S W and got under way and stood in to see the land and lost part calm at six P M lite breas from N E at seven anchor again and to scooners laying to anchor and ice between us and the land and saw brig off shore of us and rain by spells all day

Tue July 25

being calm best part the day and rain by spells all day and laying to anchor and some ice around and to scooners lay to anchor and saw ship off shore.

Wen July 26

commences with lite breas from S E and rain at five A M got under way heading S S W at seven A M anchor and calm at eleven got under way lite breas from N E and at five P M lite breas from W N W heading N and thick fog and to scooners in site

Thu July 27

commences with thick fog and wind from N W lite breas and middle part calm and anchor at five P M clear off and wind from N N E and got under way and saw land and to scooners heading W on sharp tack hands employed trimming ship with salt water

Fri July 28

being with wind from N N E and first part of the day N W and last part heading E and saw few cakes of ice and fog and rain all day

Sat July 29

commences with wind from N E and working to N thick fog first part of day at twelve clear off and saw land and some ice and to scooners
