Wen Aug 16

commences with lite breeze from NE and clear and we shifted off shore a little farther at four P M come in foggy and seal of the steamers left the pint and went to eastward

Thu Aug 17

commences with thick fog and wind from NE and last part clear off and saw the wonder came in to anchor

Fri Aug 18

commences with wind from NE and clear at ten A M got under way from the pint and working to NE with the school fleet at 10 P M come in thick fog and plenty of ice around at eight shorten sail and laying back heading NE

Sat Aug 19

commences with wind from NE and thick fog at seven A M cept off steering SE E threw ice at ten raised the crowd ice and felled it in to the pint anchor at the pint to P M and seal of the ships laying to anchor to pint seven P M shifted farther in shore on count of the ice come round the pint and ten got under way with the school fleet and laying round the ice under short sail and part blow strong

Sun Aug 20

being with thick wind from NE & N and rain all day at six A M came in to anchor at Cape Smith and seal of them laying to anchor at seven A M five of them got under way on count of the ice and plenty of ice off shore of us and blow strong

Mon Aug 21

being with wind from NE and thick fog most all day and laying to anchor at Cape Smith and seal more of them laying to anchor here

Tue Aug 22

commences with wind from N and thick fog at seven A M took one anchor and steering S W in company with seal others ships from Cape Smith and capping threw scattering ice all through the day last part wind lite

Wen Aug 23

commences with wind from S W and foggy by spells heading W & W at seven A M wind hall to S E and steering W S W at five P M spoke bark all ice knowles and three other ships and saw few cakes of ice
