

Remarks on Board Brig F. A. Pastow

Sun Oct 1

being with wind from N to NNW and heading W most all day and the island in sight bearing W and working to NE and eight vessels in sight

Mon Sept
Mon Oct 2

commences with light breeze from NNW and heading NE first part of day and last part thick fog from and wind hall to NW and W and spoke scouter fair gray and thick and several sails in sight and the most of them steering SE

Tue Oct 3

commences with fresh breeze from W and first part of day snow last part wind dying out and clear off and steering to NE at four PM put to heading SSW and spoke bark Porisho and number of sails in sight

Wen Oct 4

commences with wind from NNW and thick snow storm and working to W and last part clear and light breeze and gained bark northern light and mermaid and three other sails in sight

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Thu Oct 5

commences with light breeze from S and last part hall to SE and heading from E to ESE and snow by spells and six sails in sight and saw one vessel with boats down

Fri Oct 6

commences with wind from W and first part of day working to SSW and last part working to SE and S and middle part blowing strong snow by spells all day at dark calm and number of sails in sight and to steamers in sight

Sat Oct 7

commences with wind from WNW at day light kept off SE mored back at ten AM wind hall to S and last part of day wind holling from south to S and heavy squalls and one bark in sight and one scouter

Sun Oct 8

commences with wind from SWS heading SE at day light raised cap hisper pint on lee bow distance about thirty miles at one PM tack ship at five PM wind shifted to W and steering SSW and one vessel in sight and snowing and second mate sick and off duty
