Begins with a fine breeze from the W heading on Northern tack at daylight close to Salisbury and Nottingham Islands on different tacks middle part strong breeze took in light sails last part calm with fog and rain saw scattering ice and quite a number of walrus

First and middle part calm last part fine breeze from NNE heading by the wind on the Northern tack breaking out and filling salt water foreward to put the 8th more by the head

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.E. steering NW by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N for Bell Island at 4 A.M. saw the Island and Evans Is packed with ice kept of W to go to the Southern of Coats Island middle and last part light breeze from the E steering W by S along the land First part of these 24 hours fog last part clear

Begins with clear weather and a light breeze from the E steering W along the land middle and last part light breeze from W at 4 P.M. of Cape Southampton shaped our course for Whale point N by W $\frac{1}{2}$ W under all sail

Begins with a light breeze from W.N.W. with thick fog steering N.N.W. under all sail at noon fog lit up saw Southampton Island and found that the tide had set the vessel about 8 miles up Fishers Straits headed to the Westward wind N.N.W. at 5 P.M. wind hauled to the N.E. with thick fog steering W.N.W. last part the same

Begins with cloudy weather and a strong breeze from NW with squalls heading by the wind on different tacks took in light sails middle and last part squally
