

Friday Sept 16th

First part of this 24 hours blowing strong from the N.E. under 2 try sails and fore staysail last part light baffling breeze and calm at 1 P.M. came to an anchor to the N of Cape Fulerton in 14 fathoms of water Sch Eva in sight

Saturday Sept 17th

This 24 hours fine weather and a light breeze from the W at 4 A.M. Sch Eva came to an anchor let her have what spare provisions we had and one boat at 3.30 P.M. took our anchor and started for home steering S.P.W. took 3 seamen from the Eva to fetch home there time having expired

The name of the seamen from the Eva are Nathan, A. Shipway
Konrad ~~Warrand~~ Lefner
Peter. Blecha.

Sunday Sept 18th

This 24 hours cloudy and a fresh breeze from the N.E. steering S and E. for Coats Island at sundown off the South end of South. Hampton

Monday Sept 19th

This 24 hours cloudy and a fresh breeze from the N.E. at 3 P.M. came to an anchor off Cape South Hampton the South end of Coats Island in 10 fathoms of water thick with snow squalls

Tuesday Sept 20th

This 24 hours cloudy and a strong breeze from the N.E. at 8 A.M. took our anchor and worked up between Coats and Mansfield Islands

Wednesday Sept 21st

This 24 hours fine weather and a light breeze from the W steering to the E at sundown took in every thing but the square sail compass not working

Thursday Sept 22nd

This 24 hours cloudy with snow squalls wind N.W. steering S.E. under all sail compass beginning to work again passed Nottingham and Salisbury Islands

Friday Sept 23rd

This 24 hours strong breeze from the N.E. steering S.P.E. at dark took in all sail but square sail steering S.W. North shore in sight
