

Ship Franklin in the North Atlantic
yards and stood South East for Brazil

6th This day commences with light winds Raised
the Land at 12 o'clock noon One Sail in sight
on the Starboard Beam Men employed in breaking

7th We stood off and on the Land last night
This morning stood along the Land called
all hands at 11 o'clock and moved a Boat and
pulled the Capt ashore. Shipped a Boat steers
one of the Boat steers not having been shipped
before the Ship sailed One Sail in sight
laying off and on at Pico the Boat came along
side at 6 o'clock ~~hoisted~~ it up and squared
the yards and stood S & E

8th This day commences with light winds
Raised a Sail standing in towards the Islands
Men employed in working on the rigging

9th This day commences with calm weather The
Island of St Michael and one Sail in sight

11th This day commences with squally weather
The Island of St Michael is in sight

10th It still continues to be calm the Land and
one Sail are in sight Men employed in working
on the rigging

12th Tacked Ship at three o'clock A.M. and
run down along the Land to the Windward of
the Island in hope of seeing Whales in
a Bay that makes in the Land but the
breeze was so strong that we did not run
near enough to see Ship steering S & E

13th This day commences with a strong breeze
double reefed the Fore and single reefed
the Mizzen Top sail Ship steering S & E

14th This day commences with a strong breeze
from the Starboard Ship steering S & E

15th This day commences with fine weather
Wind North Ship steering S & E Raised a

Sail three points on the Starboard Beam
could not make out whether it was
a Steamer or a Ship. trying out Men
employed in breaking out of the chain

16th This day commences with a light breeze
Ship under all Sail steering S & E Raised
the Islands of Palma and Genes ~~they~~
being two of the Canaries at four o'clock
Man squared the yards and kept S & E

17th This day commences with a light breeze
Ship steering S W 1/2 W The Islands
of Palma Gomera Ferro are in sight

18th This day commences with light winds Ship
steering S W 1/2 W Saw breaches Layed
the chain Sloop to the Mast but not
seeing them again did not lower for it
Proceed forward the chain yard and
stood along on her course

19th This day commences with a moderate
breeze from the S & E Ship steering S W

20th This day commences with a moderate breeze
from the S & E Ship steering S W 1/2 W
breaches luffed to the wind but not
seeing it again put the helm up and
kept the ship her course again

21th Raised a sail this afternoon standing
on the Starboard tack Ship steering S & E

22th Raised the Island of St Nicholas one
of the Cape Verde Islands Raised Black Fish
toward the Boats but were unsuccessful
bore S & E

23th This day commences with a moderate
breeze from the S & E Ship steering S
two Sail in sight on the Starboard Beam
