

17<sup>th</sup> This day commences with a strong breeze from the S. Ship Laying off and on the Island of Mocha Toward away the Starboard and Bow Boat this afternoon and pulled ashore after the rest of the Patatoes the Capt purchased yesterday When we were ready to come aboard the Ship four of the Men had deserted, came aboard without their intending to lay off and on to night and go ashore after them in the morning

18<sup>th</sup> This day commences with fine weather Wind S.E. Ship steering N.W. & backed Ship this morning and stood in to the Land. Toward away the Starboard Boat this afternoon and pulled ashore after the deserters The Capt offered a reward for them and as soon as a reward was offered the Spaniards went and bound them knowing where they were but would not bind them untill they got their pay for it came aboard at 1 o'clock and put the men in irons seized their arms let them stop there untill four o'clock pm hoisted the Boat squared the yards and kept the Ship her course one Sail in sight

19<sup>th</sup> This day commences with fine weather Wind S.E. Ship steering N.W. & Raised Whales toward the Boats chased them but were unsuccessful

20<sup>th</sup> This day commences with a breeze from the S. Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight Raised Whales this afternoon 3 or 4 points on the Sea Bow

21<sup>st</sup> This day commences with fine weather Wind S.W. Ship steering N.W. The Island of Masot-Tierra Delkunks or Robinson came and three Sail in sight Raised a Whale this afternoon

22<sup>d</sup> This day commences with fine weather Wind S.W. Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight Raised Whales but they proved to be false but they

23<sup>d</sup> This day commences with squally weather S.E. Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight saw a spot

24<sup>th</sup> This day commences with cloudy weather Wind S.E. Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight off ailed a bark last night but could not make out her name

25<sup>th</sup> This day commences with the S.E. trades Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight All hands employed in breaking

26<sup>th</sup> This day commences with the S.E. trades Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight Lat 29° 3' Long 78° 00'

27<sup>th</sup> This day commences with the S.E. trades Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight Lat 29° 26' Long 78° 04'

28<sup>th</sup> This day commences with the S.E. trades Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight Lat 29° 26' Long 78° 48'

29<sup>th</sup> This day commences with the S.E. trades Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight Saw White Water Lat 29° 18' Long 78° 26'

30<sup>th</sup> This day commences with the S.E. trades Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight Saw a spot three points on the Sea Bow Lat 29° 24' Long 78° 39'

31<sup>st</sup> This day commences with the S.E. trades Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight Raised Black Fish toward the Boats but was unsuccessful

Feb<sup>th</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> 1854 This day commences with the S.E. trades Ship steering N.W. & One Sail in sight Raised Whales at 12 o'clock noon toward the Boats and chased them The Starboard Boat
