9th This day commences with the S. C. trades Ship steering N. by W. Raised sulphur bottoms and unpacks Men employed in ridding down the chain Rigger Lat 6° 18' Long 85° 55'

10th This day commences with the S. C. trades Ship steering N. by W. Men employed in ridding down the chain Rigger

11th This day commences with the S. C. trades Ship steering N. by W. Men employed in ridding down the chain Rigger Raised off Whales at 5 o'clock P.m. ahead about 2 miles off toward the Boats and chased them to day the Waste Boat was close to the whales when they made their appearance pull hard my Boys pull hard I tell you some what do you say Every man of you the Whale lays spouting little thinking of what will befall him Stand up & sayes the Officer to the Boat steerer give to him

12th This day commences with the S. C. trades Ship steering N. by W. Men employed in ridding down the chain Rigger Raised off Whales at 1 1/2 o'clock P.m. toward the Boats at 2 o'clock and chased them but were unsuccessful came along side at 5 o'clock hoisted the Boats squared the yards and kept the Ship her course Lat 3° 36' Long 87° 36'

13th This day commences with the S. C. trades Ship steering N. by W. Men employed in ridding down the chain Rigger Raised a Sail at 2 o'clock Am standing close hauled on the Larboard tack Men employed in working on the Rigger and repairing the waste Boat Lat 0° 57' Long 93° 22'

14th This day commences with the S. C. trades Ship steering N. by W. Men employed in working on the Rigger and repairing the Waste Boat Lat 0° 58' Long 95° 11'
