

2^d This day commences with light winds from the Eastward Ship steering S. by E. Men employed in breaking out nothing in sight but Pinbacks Lutter past employed in stowing down Oil Lat 2° 02' Long 124° 51'

3^d This day commences with light winds from the E. Stward Ship steering N. N. W. Men employed in breaking out Lat 3° 09' Long 125° 16'

4th This day commences with a light Easterly off wind Ship steering N. by W. Men employed in washing Ship Lat 4° 31' Long 125° 46'

5th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Lat 6° 01' Long 127° 12'

6th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Men employed in making Boats and scraping yards Lat 7° 36' Long 128° 31'

7th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Saw a Pinback employed in painting Boats Lat 9° 58' Long 132° 45'

8th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Lat 12° 02' Long 135° 35'

9th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Lat 14° 04' Long 138° 49'

10th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Lat 15° 06' Long 142° 23'

11th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Lat 16° 45' Long 145° 10'

12th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Lat 18° 25' Long 148° 44'

13th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Took in the fore and Mizzen top Gull hunt sail squally weather with some rain nothing seen Lat 19° 27' Long 152° 24'

14th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Raised a sail at 1 o'clock on the Starboard beam steering to the Westward

15th This day commences with the N. E. trades Ship steering N. by W. Raised the Land at 6 o'clock An ahead seven sail in sight Run in to the Harbor in company of the Ship Gov Group and Bart's Harming came to and let go the anchor at 4 o'clock Jm Hurler the sails cleared away a boat and pulled ashore to get some fresh provisions nothing more cured worthy of note

16th This day commences with fine weather The Starboard Watch went ashore on liberty to day it being the first time since the Ship sailed from New Bedford and came aboard at sunset The Starboard Watch employed in painting Ship Last night two of the Painters crew swam aboard The Mate came aboard this morning to search for them and found them stowed away in the fore peak he ordered them to get in to the boat and took them aboard and put them in irons

16th This day commences with Rainy weather The Starboard Watch went ashore on liberty this morning and came aboard at sunset having had enough of the shore for the first time Starboard watch employed in breaking out for back to make a raft The Sandwich Islands have so often been described that there's but little to add The Port of Hilo is situated at the head of Byron's Bay on Oahu keel The houses are mostly built of grass The principal fruit is the coconut Bread fruit Oranges Limes Bananas and Pine Apples This Island is celebrated for being the place where Capt Cook was killed by the natives The inhabitants live principally on Tarrow and Fish the Tarrow which is pounded up and mixed with water until it becomes like dough this they call Hooa
