9th Commences with a moderate breeze from the N^W Ship steering close halled on the wind Men employed in working on the rigging The Land and 1 Sail are in sight Lat 19° 55'

10th Commences with a strong breeze from the N^W Ship steering close halled Raised Black Fish at 4 o'clock P^m Lowered the Boats and chased them The Bow Boat got past but the Iron drew Came aboard at Sunset and hoisted the Boats Men employed in working on the rigging Lat 19° 07'

11th Commences with a strong breeze from the N^W Ship steering close halled on the wind Raised Black Fish at 10 o'clock P^m Lowered the Boats and chased them but were unsuccessful came along side at 1 o'clock P^m and hoisted the Boats Sailed with the Bark Rebecca Adams at 5 o'clock P^m

12th Commences with a moderate breeze from the N^W Raised Humpbacks at 5 o'clock P^m Sailed with the Bark Rebecca Adams at 5 o'clock P^m Lowered a Boat at 11 o'clock A^m and pulled along side of a Mexican Schooner with letters to send to the U. S. A. but did leave them on account of her not being bound to a port where they could be sent Ship steering E^{SE} The Land and 3 Sails are in sight

13th Commences with a light breeze from the W^W Sailed with the Bark Rebecca Adams 6 o'clock P^m Ship steering E^{SE} Men employed in working on the rigging and breaking out The Land and 3 Sails are in sight Lat 18°

14th Commences with light winds from the W^W Ship steering E^{SE} Came to and let go the Anchor at 5 o'clock and furled the Sails at 6 o'clock Capt Richmond ordered a Boat to be lowered to go aboard of the Rebecca Adams no one coming to execute the order he sent the Mate forward to see what the matter was and found that they had refused duty The Capt called all hands aft to see who they were that refused duty he told them that they were going to duty to go on the Starboard side and those that were not to go on the Starboard side off the Waist there were 10 that went on the Starboard side He inquired what they had refused for They replied that they had been out 8 months and going into a port where they were all likely to catch the Fever but if he would sign a written agreement to go where there was an American house they would return to duty He told them that he should go to the Sandwich Islands in March but he should not sign any agreement and told them that he would give them until 7 o'clock A^m to make up their minds At 7 o'clock Capt Richmond called them aft and asked them if they had concluded to go to duty they told him that they had on conditions above mentioned at their request he read the Ships articles to them after the articles were read he asked them if they were ready to turn to they replied that they were not he then ordered them to be put in Irons until they should turn to Capt Andrews of the Bark Rebecca Adams came aboard and talked to them and told them
