

17th. Commenced with changeable weather. I have been employed in reading. I have not learned any more about the particulars of yesterday's parade except that the new American Consul whose name is Jenkins has gone with the books over to Marianan. I do not know whether he intends to reside there or not. When I learn further particulars I shall note them down.

1875. On account of the rainy weather
I have not yet learned the
purpose of the meeting of
yesterday. The ~~meeting~~ was
being held at the Schooner
Irma and from Tahiti to day
on the 10th. The weather
was very disagreeable and
the relative church in a place
which was attended with the
principal chiefs for the
reception of the new American
consul his ~~message~~ bearing read
the words by the "Hawaii
missionary and to the foreign
by the 6th. The address was
given in the native
language as that I did not understand
it but as near as I could learn
the natives appeared to be perfectly
satisfied with the new American
as the natives call the consul.

21st Consumed with cold & weather where
is nothing worth noting except day 11
22nd I started on a whaler to day noon
and the other boats of the F. started in a
moment I carried a pencil and paper to
write down the passengers names &
the fish taken while loading the fish
I took the whaler to water it close
as near as I can recollect. The first
night we got under a full moon and
anchored on the west side the next
morning we hauled up the anchor
and proceeded up as a tow which
I do not recollect the name and stage
There two days we then got sundown
and proceeded up as far as Charanah
where we stayed two days longer
