Winds past then 24 hours fresh breeze from N.W. course
S.W. by compass weather hazy middle and latter part the same
saw nothing of remarkable employed in ship out so Enos
than 24 hours
Lat of Obs 21° 30' South
Long of Obs 151° 42' West

Remarks On Board Tuesday Nov 24th 1857
Winds past then 24 hours light breeze from N.W. course
S.W. middle part since hauls for S.P.E. ship heading S.W.
latter part the same saw nothing since strong ship with dullest
reflex light sails so Enos than 24 hours
Lat of Obs 28° 58' South
Long of Obs 151° 42' West

Remarks On Board Wednesday Nov 25th 1857

Winds past then 24 hours moderate gales from S.P.E. ship
by the wind to S.W. under double reefed sails middle and
latter part more moderate with wind from S. heading N.W.
by compass so Enos than 24 hours
Lat of Obs 29° 45' South
Long of Obs 151° 41' West

Remarks On Board Thursday Nov 26th 1857
Winds past then 24 hours fresh breeze from S.P.E. ship
by the wind to S.W. Breeze at New Head strong middle and
latter part since hauls for N.E. course S.W. Breeze at New
Head light sails employed in working ship for water so
Enos than 24 hours
Lat of Obs 30° 27' South
Long of Obs 151° 58' West

Remarks On Board Friday Nov 27th 1857

Winds past then 24 hours light breeze from N.E. course
S.W. weather pleasant middle and latter part since N.
Breeze at New Head saw nothing so Enos than 24 hours
Lat of Obs 31° 55' South
Long of Obs 152° 20' West

Remarks On Board Saturday Nov 28th 1857

Winds past then 24 hours fresh breeze and pleasant
wind N. course S.W. by N. middle part strong gale
latter part the same from N.W. ship increasing the
beat from 2 to 300 strokes and heavy weather till
so Enos than 24 hours
Lat of Obs 33° 46' South
Long of Obs 152° 13' West

John I. Woodland Master 1857
Remarks On Board Sunday Nov 29th 1857

Winds past then 24 hours fresh gales from N.W. ship
by the wind to S.W. employed in working for the bank
and found that ship backed on both sides in the
slames underneath increasing from 2 to 300 strokes in
heavy weather and increasing the Capt. thinking it not
prudent to proceed around Cape Horn backed to the
N. at 6 P.M. Breeze in to 20, part to stop the bank
middle and latter part strong breeze from S.W. wind
peaked to S. course N. by compass the bank increasing slowly
so Enos than 24 hours
Lat of Obs 33° 36' South
Long of Obs 152° 46' West

Remarks On Board Monday Nov 30th 1857

Winds past then 24 hours fresh breeze from S.P.E. ship
N.E. by compass middle part the same latter part fresh breeze
from N.W. ship by the wind to N.W. at 11 saw a school
of sperm whales going N. towards S. boats in chase at
12 struck so Enos than 24 hours 1 boat of fish

Remarks On Board Tuesday Dec 1st 1857

Winds past thick and squally 1 boat of fish and got store
boat saw the whale at 4 P.M. both the whale in
the ship and got ready for cutting and all secure
for the night at daylight commenced cutting and finished
and stored N. by E. so Enos than 24 hours
Lat of Obs 29° 53' South
Long of Obs 152° 55' West

Remarks On Board Wednesday Dec 2nd 1857

Winds past then 24 hours fresh breeze S.W. course N.
by E. employed in clearing up deck at daylight can do
boiling latter part employed boiling course N.W. so Enos
than 24 hours
Lat of Obs 27° 44' South
Long of Obs 152° 07' West

Remarks On Board Thursday Dec 3rd 1857

Winds past then 24 hours strong breeze from E. steering to
N.W. employed in boiling middle and latter part
the same with strong gales so Enos than 24 hours
the bank the same
Lat of Obs 26° 08' South
Long of Obs 148° 45' West
