

Remarks On Board Tuesday Dec 29th 1857

Birds pass then 24 hours rain, finished outside and
righted up commenced stowing off latter part raining
put on the hatch for the night so Enos
this day Thomas Pickels assisted

Remarks On Board Wednesday Dec 30th 1857

Birds pass then 24 hours Employed in stowing
off on the fore hatch way latter part raining
so Enos then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Thursday Dec 31st 1857

Birds pass rain latter part pleasant hauled off
from the ship Paul and came to Anchor outside
the shipping so Enos the day

Remarks On Board Friday Jan 1st 1858

Birds pass then 24 hours rain latter the same Employed
in getting ready for sea so Enos this day

Remarks On Board Saturday Jan 2nd 1858

Birds pass pleasant Employed painting ship outside
latter part the same finished painting ship so
Enos this day

Remarks On Board Sunday Jan 3rd 1858

Birds pass then 24 hours weather pleasant ship ready
for sea waiting for men so Enos this day

Remarks On Board Monday Jan 4th 1858

Birds pass then 24 hours weather rain all on hand
on Board except the men Decided waiting for
men ship ready for sea so Enos this day

Remarks On Board Tuesday Jan 5th 1858

Birds pass then 24 hours weather pleasant waiting
to receive the runaway ship ready for sea
so Enos this day ship lying in the harbour
Rio de Janeiro

Remarks On Board Wednesday Jan 6th 1858

Birds pass then 24 hours weather pleasant caught one
man and took him On Board Thomas Pickels
4 men missing from the ship ship ready for sea
waiting for the men so Enos this day

Remarks On Board Thursday Jan 7th 1858

Birds pass then 24 hours weather pleasant both one of
the deserters on Board and put him in some
latter part took another on board and put him in
some so Enos this day

Remarks On Board Friday Jan 8th 1858

Birds pass then 24 hours pleasant ship 3 men in the
place of those deserters ship ready for sea

Remarks On Board Saturday Jan 9th 1858

Birds pass pleasant at 12 M. took the two boats and
steamed down the bay at 1.30 M. saw sails and came
to work off the land at 6 took 24 boats from W. side
Q. at 1.30 M. Rays Island Light bore W. 5 miles distant
Middle part light and latter part calm so Enos
then 24 hours
Lat 23, 45 South
Long 134, 43 West
