Winds past then 24 hours strong gale from S.W. ship heading
S.W. at 1 P.M. reefed the foresails and hauled to N.W.
Middle part more moderate made sail from N.
to S.W. (Com) played setting up the main rigging latter part
blowing on with in fore topsails ship heading S.W. compass
weather clear blowing strong with a heavy sea nothing
in sight so far as then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Friday Jan 22^d 1838

Winds past then 24 hours strong gale from S.W. at 4 P.M.
wind hauled to N.W. and moderate made sail heading
S.W. compass Middle part fresh gale latter part more moderate
made sail at 10 A.M. some ships to N.W. compass weather clear
so far as then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Saturday Jan 23^d 1838

Winds past then 24 hours moderate wind from S. heading to
N.W. Middle part calm latter part light breeze from
N. to N.W. course S.W. compass weather pleasant

Remarks On Board Sunday Jan 24th 1838

Winds past then 24 hours fresh breezes from N.W. to N.
course S.W. compass weather clear Middle part
fresh gale from N. steering S.W. compass
latter part the same wind from N.W. weather
squally with thunder and lightning and rain at
10 A.M. double reefed the topsails and furled the
main sail at 11. More moderate set the main sail
and jib saw nothing of remark so far as then 24 hours

Winds past then 24 hours fresh breeze from N.W. ship to
the wind to S.W. compass Middle and latter part fresh
breeze from N. to N.W. weather clear and strong wind so

Remarks On Board Tuesday Jan 26th 1838

Winds past then 24 hours strong gale from N. ship heading S.W.
wind clear reefed topsails Middle part the same latter part more
moderate some ships to N.W. and made sail a heavy swell
from S.W. so far as then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Wednesday Jan 27th 1838

Winds past then 24 hours light air from S.W. at 4 P.M. calm
Middle part light air from N.E. course S.W. compass latter
part fresh breeze from E. N.E. to N.E. course S.W. weather pleasant
so far as then 24 hours

Winds past then 24 hours fresh breeze from N.W. course
S.W. compass Middle part the same latter part moderate
gale and rain from N. course S.W. compass

Winds past then 24 hours fresh gale from the N.
and rain course S.W. compass weather foggy
with squalls of rain at 4 P.M. cleared up wind
hauled to N.W. steering to the wind to S.W. with
a heavy swell from N. Middle part fresh breeze from
S.W. to N.W. ship made double reefed topsails latter part
fresh gale with in jib and main sail clear reefed the
topsails ship heading S.W. low a ship to windward
weather squally with light rain so far as then 24 hours
