Winds from then 24 hours moderate gales from the S.W. to S. at 1 P.M. were ships to N. weather here moderate breeze with
 middle part calm latter part light air from S.W. to N. course
 S.W. to E. end then 24 hours

Long. 151° 31' 31" West

 Winds from then 24 hours fresh breeze from S. course S.W. ship
 in sight steering to same middle part strong gales from S.
 course S.W. latter part S.W. to E. some fine weather the
 same to E. end then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Monday Feb 1st 1838

Winds from then 24 hours fresh breeze from S. course S.W.
 S.W. weather clear at 1 P.M. here to and rounded got
 bottom in 60 fathoms black and yellow sand with
 off S.W. compass saw plenty of kelp weather quite pleasant
 middle part moderate breeze from S.W. to S. and
 pleasant course S.W. compass latter part S.W. to E. weather
 pleasant and clear saw a fin back strange speck of
 remarks so ends then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Tuesday Feb 2nd 1838

Winds from then 24 hours light breeze from S. steering S.W. to E.
 at 1 P.M. S.W. to E. weather pleasant middle and latter part
 the same course S.W. to E. by compass weather pleasant saw nothing
 so ends then 24 hours

 Winds from then 24 hours light breeze from S. to N. course
 S.W. to E. middle and latter part light air from E. and
 rainy ship heading S.W. to E. and weather thick and hazy
 so ends then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Thursday Feb 4th 1838

Winds from then 24 hours light breeze and pleasant from E. to S.W. by E.
 ship heading S.W. to E. ship in sight at 2 P.M. made the Lander
 Station Island bearing S.W. by S. 15 miles at 4 P.M. looked to
 S.W. middle part looked to the S.W. weather thick with rain and fog
 latter part at 8 P.M. looked to S.W. weather foggy with light
 at 11 looked to S.W. by E. A French frigate off the Lander
 Island bearing to the westward with from E. to S.W. ship heading S.W.
 by the wind saw nothing of remark this day so ends
 then 24 hours
Lat. 31° 31' 31" South
Long. 151° 31' 31" West

Remarks On Board Friday Feb 5th 1838

Winds from then 24 hours light breeze from S.W. ship by the wind
 to E. by E. at 5 P.M. some from S. hauled to N.W. steering to E.
 by S.W. compass middle and latter part S.W. to E. at
 daylight saw Station Island bearing S.W. 15 miles distance
 hauled up by the wind to S.W. at 10 A.M. wind hauled
 to S.W. course S.W. by compass weather quite pleasant
 with light winds from S.W. to N.W. at 12 M. Cape St. John
 bore N.W. by compass 18 miles 1 ship in sight steering the
 same way so ends then 24 hours

Long. 151° 31' 31" West

Remarks On Board Saturday Feb 6th 1838

Winds from then 24 hours calm at 3 P.M. light breeze from S.W. to E.
 ship heading S.W. the land N.W. by S.W. compass 20 miles 4 sails
 in sight middle part light air from S.W. to N. heading to S.
 latter part calm so ends then 24 hours
No Observation

Remarks On Board Sunday Feb 7th 1838

Winds from then 24 hours light air and calm course S.W. by S.W. compass
 from S.W. to E. 4 sails in sight middle and latter part light variable
 ship by the wind to S. and N. at daylight Station Island in sight
 bearing N.W. by compass so ends this day
Lat. 31° 31' 31" South
Long. 151° 31' 31" West
