Direct pass then 24 hours light breeze from N. E. ship by the wind to N. E. at 5 P. M. latter to S. E. Middle and latter part moderate gales from S. E. ship by the wind to N. E. M. under short sail so Endeavour then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Thursday Feb 18th 1838

Direct pass then 24 hours moderate gales from N. E. ship by the wind to N. E. M. weather thick and rainy at 2 P. M. took in fore top sail Middle part the same latter part moderate breeze sail heading S. E. by N. weather rainy and wind light so Endeavour then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Friday Feb 19th 1838

Direct pass then 24 hours light breeze from N. E. weather thick and rainy ship by the wind to N. E. M. and S. E. Middle part some ship to N. E. latter part calm clear and pleasant saw nothing so Endeavour then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Saturday Feb 20th 1838

Direct pass light breeze from N. E. steering N. E. by compass at 7 P. M. strong wind and rain double reefed the top sails course N. E. Middle and latter part light breeze and thick fog course N. E. so Endeavour then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Sunday Feb 21st 1838

Direct pass then 24 hours light breeze from S. E. and thick fog course N. E. by compass Middle part strong gales and rain latter part the same blowing strong in squalls course N. E. by compass weather rainy saw a ship steering the same way took in the main top sail blowing heavy from S. and squally nothing more of remark so Endeavour then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Monday Feb 22^d 1838

Direct pass then 24 hours strong gales from S. steering N. E. by compass Middle part the same latter part moderate sea all sail and flew N. E. by N. and N. E. M. one sail in sight since 4 P. M. by compass so Endeavour then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Tuesday Feb 23^d 1838

Direct pass then 24 hours light breeze from N. course N. E. by compass Cape Horn S. J. Parker Capt. to Shair. Middle part wind hauled to N. E. latter to N. E. by compass weather rainy latter part clear latter again to N. E. by compass weather squally saw nothing of remark so Endeavour then 24 hours

Direct pass then 24 hours fresh breeze from N. E. to N. E. by compass the wind to N. E. weather squally Middle part the same latter part strong gales S. E. to N. course N. E. by compass one sail in sight sound so Endeavour then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Friday Feb 26th 1838

Direct pass then 24 hours moderate breeze from S. E. and squally course N. E. by compass a ship in sight (Blond N. Middle and latter part light breeze from S. E. and pleasant sea up main Royal Barge 2 sails in sight (Bouca N. saw nothing so Endeavour then 24 hours
