 boat Middle and latter part ship by the wind to N. E.
 strong wind and rough weather saw nothing of remarks
 so Enos then 24 hours
 Lat of Obs 25° 50' North
 Long of Obs 114° 11' West

Remarks On Board Wednesday May 26th 1838

Sun, part strong breeze from N. W. to N. E. at 1 P. M.
 P. M. saw 4 school sperm whales off weather beam lower
 4 boats and struck 3 killed them and took alongside the
 ship at 10 weather rough and wind strong Middle part the
 same latter part calling at 1 P. M. finished and com-
 to clear up the deck
 Lat of Obs 25° 11' North

 up the deck at 10 P. M. started the work ship heading to
 N. E. latter part ship to N. E. employed in sailing to
 Enos then 24 hours

 N. E. M. Middle part looked to N. E. employed in
 sailing weather rough with a heavy sea saw nothing
 so Enos then 24 hours

 Long of Obs 114° 02' West
