 Long of Obs 114° 02' West

Remarks On Board Saturday June 12th 1858
 Sun's pass fresh breeze from N. W. ship heading N. W. E. land in sight at 6 P. M. were ship to N. N. W. Middle and latter part calm saw nothing of remarks this day so Enos then 24 hours
 Lat of Obs 26° 30' North
 Long of Obs 114° 18' West

Remarks On Board Sunday June 13th 1858

Sun's pass light air from N. W. ship heading S. at 6 P. M. with in sail heading S. W. Middle and latter part calm at 10⁰⁰ saw sperm whales going to S. E. very quick towards the boats but could not come up with them it being calm for Enos then 24 hours
 Lat of Obs 26° 12' North
 Long of Obs 114° 26' West

Remarks On Board Monday June 14th 1858
 Sun's pass calm the boats in chase at 3 P. M. came on board the whales out of sight of the boats Middle and latter part light air from the Eastward attended with thick fog ship going ahead for Enos then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 15th 1858

Sun's pass then 24 hours calm with thick fog Middle and latter part the same for Enos then 24 hours
 No Observations

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 16th
 Sun's pass then 24 hours light air from E. with thick fog Middle part the same latter part clearing up made sails stowed S. E. land in sight saw nothing to day so Enos this day
 Lat of Obs 24° 14' North
 Long of Obs 114° 00' West

Sun's pass then 24 hours fresh breeze from N. W. ship heading N. W. the wind to S. W. spoke ship Clifton Wayne and West Island Middle and latter part heading to S. W. saw nothing to Enos then 24 hours
 Lat of Obs 25° 10' North
 Long of Obs 114° 11' West

Remarks On Board Friday June 18th 1858
 Sun's pass strong breeze from N. W. ship heading N. W. E. the wind to S. W. Middle part towards N. N. E. latter part the same saw a sail to windward nothing more of remarks so Enos then 24 hours
 Lat of Obs 25° 31' North
 Long of Obs 114° 25' West

Remarks On Board Saturday June 19th 1858

Sun's pass then 24 hours fresh breeze from N. W. ship heading N. W. E. the wind to S. W. Middle part the same latter part towards E. of compass saw a sail in sight nothing more of remarks so Enos then 24 hours
 Lat of Obs 25° 43' North
 Long of Obs 114° 04' West

Remarks On Board Sunday June 20th 1858

Sun's pass then 24 hours strong breeze from N. W. ship heading S. W. Middle part the same latter part heading to N. N. E. 3 sails in sight for Enos then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Monday June 21st 1858

Sun's pass then 24 hours strong breeze from N. W. ship heading N. W. E. the wind saw sperm whales towards the boats got on at 1 P. M. took them alongside the ship and took in sails at daylight some cutting at 1 P. M. and came up so Enos this day
 Lat of Obs 24° 57' North
 Long of Obs 114° 03' West
