First part fresh breeze from S. E. heaving E. S. E. one sail in sight
upwind the fore top gullies sails Middle and latter part
heaving E. S. E. of compass saw nothing of remark
so Enos then 24 hours
Lat of Obs 30° 27' North
Long of Chem 110° 48' West

First part strong breeze from S. heaving E. S. E. weather hazy
Middle and latter part strong trades heaving E. S. E. of compass
saw nothing of remark so Enos then 24 hours
No Observation

Remarks On Board Tuesday August 25th 1838
First part strong trades from S. heaving E. S. E. weather thick
and squally Middle and latter part Moderate breeze
from E. S. E. heaving E. of compass Employed in ship
and saw nothing of remark so Enos then 24 hours
No Observation

Remarks On Board Wednesday August 26th 1838
First part moderate trades from S. E. heaving E. of compass
saw nothing Middle and latter part the same saw nothing
of remark so Enos this day
Lat of Obs 30° 22' North
Long of Chem 110° 30' West

Remarks On Board Thursday August 27th 1838
First part light breeze from S. E. heaving E. of the wind
Middle and latter part heaving E. S. E. Employed in
repairing sails saw nothing of remark so Enos
then 24 hours
Lat of Obs 30° 42' North
Long of Chem 110° 48' West

Remarks On Board Friday August 28th

First part light breeze from S. heaving E. S. E. of the
wind Middle and latter part the same saw nothing so
Enos then 24 hours No Observation

Remarks On Board Saturday August 29th 1838
First part light breeze from S. heaving E. S. E. at 3 P. M.
saw a school of sperm whales going to windward
lowered the boats without success at 4. came on board
and took up the boats Middle part, latched to mast at 11 A. M.
saw whales lowered the boats struck 1 once Middle and latter
part the boats in chase so Enos
Lat of Obs 30° 15' North
Long of Chem 110° 48' West

Remarks On Board Sunday August 30th 1838
First part boats in chase at 3 P. M. took in whale alongside
and took up the boats once commenced cutting at 1 P. M.
down for the night at 1. finished cutting and started the boats
so Enos then 24 hours
Lat of Obs 30° 14' North
Long of Chem 110° 48' West

Remarks On Board Monday August 31st 1838
First part light trades heaving E. S. E. of the wind Employed
in boiling Middle and latter part the same saw nothing
of remark this day
Lat of Obs 30° 21' North
Long of Chem 110° 14' West

Remarks On Board Tuesday August 31st 1838
First part light trades and pleasant heaving E. S. E. Employed
in boiling Middle part finished boiling latter part heaving
E. S. E. of compass saw nothing of remark this day so Enos
then 24 hours
Lat of Obs 30° 08' North
Long of Chem 110° 14' West

First part fresh trades and pleasant heaving E. S. E. Middle
and latter part thick and hazy heaving E. S. E. saw
nothing of remark so Enos then 24 hours
Lat of Obs 30° 34' North
Long of Chem 110° 18' West
