Remarks On Board Monday March 22nd 1839

First part this day moderate breeze from N.W. ship by the wind to N.W. Co. at 1 P.M. saw the coast of California point beyond bearing N.W. Co. died 20 miles were ship off shore and took in sail middle part lashed to N.W. Co. latter part lashed to N.W. weather suggests saw Sulphur Bottoms in Enos this day

Remarks On Board Tuesday March 23rd 1839

First part this day strong breeze from N.W. ship heading N.W. Co. middle part lashed to N.W. Co. by N.W. compass latter part the same weather, clear and wind strong saw Pinbuckles and Sulphur Bottoms for Enos then 24 hours

Long 113° 39' West

Remarks On Board Wednesday March 24th

First part this day strong breeze from N.W. ship heading N.W. Co. saw Pinbuckles and the land lashed off shore middle part lashed to N.W. Co. to N.W. Co. latter part lashed to N.W. Co. saw nothing for Enos then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Saturday March 26th

First part this day moderate breeze from N.W. to N.W. ship heading N.W. Co. middle and latter part the same wind light from N.W. to N.W. saw nothing for Enos

Remarks On Board Sunday March 27th 1839

First part light breeze from N.W. heading N.W. Co. Lawrence for Sulphur Bottoms at 6 P.M. lashed to N.W. middle and latter part heading the same with strong wind and rugged weather nothing for Enos this day

Long 114° 07' West

Remarks On Board Monday March 28th 1839

First part this day strong breeze from N.W. ship by the wind to N.W. Co. middle and latter moderate gale from N.W. bore ship to N.W. Co. by the wind further haze with strong gale saw nothing for Enos then 24 hours
Lat 35° 09' North
Long 113° 31' West

Remarks On Board Tuesday March 29th 1839

First part this day strong gale from N.W. heading N.W. Co. at 4 P.M. bore ship to N.W. Co. took in the fore top sail and closed the sails blowing strong middle and latter the same bore to heading N.W. Co. to N.W. Co. for Enos
Lat 34° 43' North
Long 114° 20' West

Remarks On Board Wednesday March 30th

First this day strong gale from N.W. by the wind to heading N.W. Co. to N.W. Co. middle and latter part the same blowing strong with a heavy fog for Enos this day
Lat 34° 53' North
Long 113° 13' West

Remarks On Board Thursday March 31st 1839

First part this day more moderate at 6 P.M. bore ship to N.W. Co. and at the fore top sail middle part the same latter part fresh breeze and a heavy swell heading to N.W. Co. saw nothing for Enos this day

Long 114° 13' West
