First part this day fresh breeze from N.W. heading to N.E. weather, puffs, middle part the same latter part lull to the N.W. blowing a gale from N.W. ships going to the North came to anchor this day
 Lat. 33° 11' North
 Long. 113° 35' West

Remarks On Board Saturday April 2^d 1839

First part this day blowing a gale from N.W. ships going to heading to Westwards middle part the same latter part were ships to N.E. with moderate gales saw nothing of remark this day
 Lat. 34° 33' North
 Long. 113° 46' West

Remarks On Board Sunday April 3^d 1839

First part this day moderate gales from N.W. heading N.E. by compass middle part heading N.W. latter part steering E. by S. saw nothing for Enos
 Lat. 34° 13' North
 Long. 113° 34' West

Remarks On Board Monday April 4th 1839

First part this day the winds more moderate made sails steering E. by S. saw the Long Cape Light 5 miles at 6 P.M. were ships off shore to S.W. by N. latter part steering off E. by N. Employed in getting up the main rigging weather clear for Enos then 34 hours
 Lat. 34° 09' North
 Long. 112° 36' West

Remarks On Board Tuesday April 5th 1839

First part this day strong breeze saw a school of sperm whales going quick to windward however the boats in chase but could not come up with them at 3 P.M. took up the boats whale out of sight to windward middle part heading N.W. latter part lull to N.E. for Enos
 Lat. 34° 02' North
 Long. 113° 02' West

Remarks On Board Wednesday April 6th 1839

First part this day moderate breeze ships heading N.E. middle middle part the same latter part lull to N.E. by N. saw nothing for Enos this day
 Lat. 34° 07' North
 Long. 113° 01' West

Remarks On Board Thursday April 7th

First part this day light breeze and heading by the wind to N.E. middle part the same latter part saw a school of sperm whales however the at 4 in chase at 8 struck one killed him and took him to the ship and shot butting

Remarks On Board Friday April 8th 1839

First part this day Employed in cutting at night going by the head the Boat on deck latter part finished cutting and came to boiling weather pleasant saw Blackfish and the land for Enos then 34 hours
 Lat. 35° 32' North
 Long. 113° 01' West

Remarks On Board Saturday April 9th 1839

First part this day light breeze heading N. Employed in boiling middle part rain cooler down latter part clear weather started the books again weather calm and clear saw nothing of remark for Enos this day
 Lat. 36° 30' North
 Long. 113° 36' West

Remarks On Board Sunday April 10th 1839

First part this day light breeze and calm Employed in boiling ships heading to N.E. middle part latter part the same saw the land to N.E. Employed in boiling for Enos this day
 Lat. 36° 13' North
 Long. 112° 36' West

Remarks On Board Monday April 11th 1839

First part this day light breeze from N.W. heading N.W. Employed in boiling spoke Boat Sacramento 11 Northward 40 lbs finished boiling latter part heading N.E. lull to N.W. a sail on sight for Enos then 34 hours
 Lat. 34° 05' North

Remarks On Board Tuesday April 12th 1839

First part this day strong breeze from N.W. lull to N.W. middle part lull to N.E. weather puffs with moderate gale a sail in sight saw nothing more of remark for Enos then 34 hours
 Lat. 34° 10' North
 Long. 112° 36' West
