Wind past this day strong breeze from N. by heading N. N. E. by the wind Middle part weather to N. N. W. latter part to N. N. W. Dead sperm whale going S. E. towards the boat in chase at 12. As struck & saw the load the other speaking blood took the long and load time for time No observation

Remarks On Board Monday June 13<sup>th</sup> 1839

Wind past this day at 4. P. M. took the whale alongside and cut from the p. S. Kimmell in sight cutting one whale latter part (Employed in boiling weather thick and heavy saw nothing so time than 24 hours Lat of Obs 33° 13' North Long of Obs 114° 10' West

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 14<sup>th</sup> 1839

Wind past this day moderate breeze and thick weather ship heading to N. N. E. ship near ship of crew lower in sight Whaling saw two large whale (Employed in boiling) so time for time than 24 hours

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 15<sup>th</sup> 1839

Wind past this day light breeze past sperm whale in company with ship near ship lower than boat in chase the Chocoma was together and S. P. M. struck one whale from and took time along side at dusk at day work cutting at 12 finished the being alongside for time than 24 hours Lat of Obs 34° 49' North Long of Obs 113° 08' West

Remarks On Board Thursday June 13<sup>th</sup> 1839

Wind past this day strong breeze from N. W. ship by the wind to N. N. E. (Employed boiling) sails in sight middle and latter part heading to N. N. E. saw nothing (Employed boiling) so time than 24 hours No Obs

Remarks On Board Friday June 16<sup>th</sup> 1839

Wind past this day fresh breeze from N. W. heading at N. S. W. (Employed in boiling) middle part finished boiling latter part heading to N. with light breeze saw nothing of remarks for time this day No observation

Wind past this day light air from N. heading N. N. W. by the wind Middle part the same latter part calm (Employed cooping) City weather moderate saw nothing of remarks for time than 24 hours Lat of Obs 34° 26' North Long of Obs 114° 10' West

Remarks On Board Sunday June 18<sup>th</sup> 1839

Wind past this day light air from S. W. heading N. by W. sails in sight Middle part calm latter part light air from N. saw at (Wind moderate) (Weather pleasant) (Saw 12 whales in sight for time than 24 hours Lat of Obs 34° 13' North Long of Obs 114° 06' West

Remarks On Board Monday June 20<sup>th</sup> 1839

Wind past this day light air from N. heading N. N. W. saw at (Saw 12 whales in sight) Middle part light air with thunder and lightning and light rain latter part (Employed in plowing down) City sails in sight for time than 24 hours Lat of Obs 35° 23' North Long of Obs 114° 00' West

Remarks On Board Tuesday June 21<sup>st</sup> 1839

Wind past this day light breeze and foggy heading to N. (Employed in plowing down) City Middle and latter part foggy ships by the wind to S. W. by N. S. sails in sight for time this day Lat of Obs 34° 53' North Long of Obs 114° 23' West

Remarks On Board Wednesday June 22<sup>nd</sup>

Wind past this day fresh breeze from N. W. ship by the wind to N. N. W. at 6. P. M. saw sperm whale at 6.30 lowered the boat in company with Sacramento struck & killed then and took one to each ship at day end time in and lowered by more struck & and took them along side the ship & boat still in chase weather foggy in squalls for time than 24 hours Lat of Obs 34° 23' North Long of Obs 114° 23' West
