First part this day, strong breeze from E. S. E. steering N. W. S. by 2 P. M. passed Diamond Head the Harbor of Honolulu in sight at 4 P. M. took a Pilot and with 100 men landed inside the reef and came to anchor in four fathoms of water. Latter part, Employees in coopersing Cils

This day all hands (Employees in getting off water

This day all hands (Employees on board getting off water and taking on provisions

Remarks On Board Thursday Sept 1st

This day all hands (Employees on board getting water and provisions On Board Friday afternoon finished

First part this day, One watch on shore on Liberty. Employees in planting ship out side

This day, One watch on shore on Liberty to other Employees in planting outside for Enos

This day, One watch on shore on Liberty for Enos

Remarks On Board Monday Sept 5th 1839
First part this day, Employees in painting ship on watch on shore on Liberty for Enos this day

Remarks On Board Tuesday Sept 6th 1839
This day, One watch on shore on Liberty to other Employees on board getting ready for day

Remarks On Board Wednesday Sept 7th
This day, One watch on shore on Liberty

Remarks On Board Thursday Sept 8th 1839

This day all ready for shipping. Kanakapoo and took them On Board put 2 men from here and 2 men from in Boardroom

Remarks On Board Friday Sept 9th 1839
First part of this day, with all hands on Board took over Anchorage and passed out side the reef discharges the sails and flood down passed the side of the Island from W. to N. W. Middle and latter part of the wind to N. W. and N. N. W. latter part, light air. Hearing N. E. W. saw the Island of Kauai. A Kanakapoo jumped overboard in the night 20 miles from land for Enos this day
