 to middle part of the S. E. latitude from C. & Co. (Compass)  
 in repairing. No rain to sea. Nothing of remark  
 peculiar pleasant for Ensigns 24 hours  
 Latitude 1. 44 North  
 Longitude 82. 29 West

Remarks on Borneo Sunday July 29<sup>th</sup>

Birds pass this day, birds, trades birds, pleasant strings  
 E.g. N. & compass. No little pass, number of the winter  
 to P.E. falls, pass the same time. Nothing of remarks  
 on Enas then 24 hours. Lat. & Long. 38 North  
 Long. 74 West.

Remarks On Birnie Niagara July 30<sup>th</sup>  
First part this day fresh & fair heading N.E. A swell  
in Gulf from N. Niagara and latter part of the forenoon  
to N.E. weather pleasant saw nothing of remark  
for comes the 30<sup>th</sup> June Sat. 6<sup>th</sup> the 30<sup>th</sup> 44 north  
Long. 83.64 West.

saw nothing of ship for Eurus this day. Left at 11.30 A.M.

Remarks Mr. Boura Saturday August 4<sup>th</sup>

This part this day fresh breezes blowing. W. Sailed 4 sails by 11.00  
 Whales middle panels better. part selling prices heading N. B. C.  
 A compass saw. Nothing of particular weather. Clear 25  
 P. One then at 11.00 Sailed 4 sails by 11.00  
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Remarks on Board. Spencer, August 3<sup>rd</sup>  
First pair this year spring females heading W. 1/2 N. 1/2 E. the limit  
of cattle and cattle past the same locality. Spent with  
eight pairs saw nothing of remarks so close this 24 hours  
South of Ohio 1/2 S. North  
Long of them 8 1/2 S. West

Remarks On Board Tuesday August 7<sup>th</sup> 1860

to U.S. Middle Pass, landed to N. P. M. weather, suggests  
fine nothing of remarks for London Lat. 41° 10' N. Long  
Lat. 1° 10' W. 8 1/2 10 mms
