This day all hands on board getting the ship ready for
sea shipyard on shore before the mast

Remarks On Board Tuesday Dec 4th 1860
This day all hands on board ship ready for sea

Remarks On Board Wednesday Dec 5th
First part all hands on board ship ready for sea
latter part at 3 P.M. put out anchor and steamed to
sea steering N. by E. at 13 M. Bore being 6 1/2 M. 13
miles for Cape then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Thursday Dec 6th 1860

First part this day light breeze from North steering N. by E.
Landed on ship Chiville part provisions for landward the
latter part the same Cape Blanco bearing E. by E. for Cape
then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Friday Dec 7th 1860

First part this day light breeze from ship to point
Landed on ship Chiville and latter part provisions
up for light for Cape then 24 hours

Remarks On Board Saturday Dec 8th 1860

First part strong trade ship heading in for light
at 3 P.M. sent a boat on shore for letters Chiville
and latter part lying off and on in Cape then
24 hours

Remarks On Board Sunday Dec 9th 1860
First part strong trade at 6 P.M. with all on board steamed
out to sea at 6 P.M. point Bore 10 miles and
Chiville part steering to the point for A.M. latter part the same
weather thick and foggy saw nothing up to the point
then 24 hours Lat. 45° 5' 17" South

Remarks On Board Monday Dec 10th 1860

First part this day light breeze from N.E. heading N. by E. the
point Chiville part the same latter part saw Blackfish got
1 weather pleasant wind light sent two foretop gallant sail
for Cape then 24 hours Lat. 45° 5' 38" South

Remarks On Board Tuesday Dec 11th 1860
First part this day light breeze and pleasant heading N. by E.
to the point Chiville part the same latter part Employers
boarding ship sails weather pleasant saw nothing up
remained for Cape then 24 hours Lat. 45° 6' 17" South

Remarks On Board Wednesday Dec 12th

First part this day light breeze from N.E. heading N. by E. by
compass Chiville part the same latter part heading
N. by E. weather pleasant wind light saw nothing for Cape
then 24 hours Lat. 45° 7' 12" South
Long 74° 44' West

Remarks On Board Thursday Dec 13th 1860

First part this day light breeze and pleasant ship to the
point for A.M. 1/2 P.M. saw Blackfish got one Chiville
and latter part the point for A.M. weather pleasant
for Cape then 24 hours Lat. 45° 7' 32" South
