31 On May 26th 1878
 Clear 24 hours Light air from N.W. W
 with a heavy swell from W.
 11 o'clock 4 or 5 small Blackfish
 going to N.W. saw 10 fish & a
 bunch of Shrimps we have seen a
 number of them to End. Lat 29° 52'
 Long 50° 00'

32 Mon May 27th 1878
 Clear 24 hours Light breeze from N.W.
 air on land nothing more. To
 End. Lat 29° 57'
 Long 50° 28'

33 On May 28th 1878
 Clear 24 hours Light air from N.W. W
 air on land sea calm. To
 End. Lat 31° 00'
 Long 50° 01'

34 Wed. May 29th 1878
 Clear 24 hours Light air from S.W.
 Every thing looking quiet -
 air on land. To End. Lat 30° 13'
 Long 49° 44'

35 On May 30th 1878
 First part of the day heavy Light
 breeze from N.W. W. Last part wind
 from N.W. W. & calm. Looking
 rather quiet. To End.
 Lat 29° 56'
 Long 49° 55'

On the Western Ground 1878

36 On May 31st 1878
 Clear 24 hours Light air all round the
 compass. Thick weather with a good
 deal of fog and observation
 to End.

37 On June 1st 1878
 First part of the day heavy Light air from
 W. Middle & last part wind from East
 10 o'clock spoke the Whaling Scho
 B. P. Sparks one month out - Calm
 thick fog all day & night. No
 observation to End.

38 On June 2nd 1878
 Clear 24 hours Light breeze from N.W. W
 with a plenty of fog. Daylight now
 B. P. Sparks to understand we made
 sail steering to S.W. to observation
 to End.

39 On June 3rd 1878
 Clear 24 hours Light air from East
 & heavy air from N.W. & last part
 sea nothing more but a plenty of
 tide rips nothing stirring or looking
 whaly. To End. Lat 29° 26'
 Long 49° 57'

40 On June 4th 1878
 Clear 24 hours Light air & pleasant
 weather. Steering S.W. by W. Every thing
 looks dry in fair air. Both of
 Gulf and to End. Lat 29° 05'
 Long 50° 46'
