Remarks on Board Thursday August 4 1836

4 First part Light Winds from the E by S Steered by S 1/2 E at 9 am winds heard E by S and at 6 P.M. by E at 7 am took ship to the E by E Winds S E by S one sail in light at midnight winds heard S by W Steered E by S at 8 am winds S W by S Employed in Boiling Black fish Saw two sail Steering E by W Sails

Long at 4-27-44 66-48 West

Remarks on Board Friday August 5 1836

5 First part fine winds from the SW lower E by S with all drawing sail set Employed in Ships duty Middle part Squally at 9 am took in the 3 & 4 sails at middle part midnight double reef the Topmast Sails set more moderate at 8 am made all sail two sail to the South Steering E by E Sails

Remarks on Board Saturday August 6 1836

6 These 24 hours commences with brisk wind from the W by N lower E by E with all drawing sail set employed in Ships duty at 1 am spoke the Ship Eaton of Boston from New England Board to Cadiz Middle part light winds at 4 am winds heard to the W by N latter part winds E by E Steered by S E with all sail set

Long by led Lode 61-12 West

Remarks on Board Sunday August 7 1836

7 First part light winds and variable Steered by S E and South with all sail set from 6 to 12 South at midnight winds heard to the S E by S took ship to the E by E at 1 am Steered East latter part winds W by S with all sail set one sail in sight to the South Sails

Long by led Lode 59-46 West

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Remarks on Board Monday August 8 1836

8 These 24 hours commences with fine winds from the W by N and cloudy Clear East with all sail set Middle part Fresh Gale with rain at 8 am took in the Top Mast Sails at 2 am winds heard to the W by N latter part more moderate and clear at 8 am set the M J sail all hands Employed in Ships duty Variation 1 Point West only

Long by led Lode 56-41 West

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 9 1836

9 First part Fresh Gale from the W by N with a large small lower East Middle part light air and calm at 8 am winds heard to the SW lower East with all sail set all hands Employed in Ships duty

Lat by obs 38-23 North  
Long by led Lode 58-27 West

Remarks on Board Wednesday August 10 1836

10 First part fine winds from the SW by S lower East with all sail set at 9 am took in the 3 & 4 sails with strong gale at 8 double reef the Topmast accompanied with Thunder lightning and rain at midnight handed the main Topmast and main lower at 8 am heard to the W by N latter part light air and calm one watch Employed in Ships duty Sails

Lat by obs 38-40 North  
Long by led Lode 53-00 West

Remarks on Board Thursday August 11 1836

11 These 24 hours commences with Brisk from the W by E and cloudy with some showers of rain Steered by East with Topmast courses 3, 4 and Spanker Middle and latter part much the same winds W by E Steered by E by S Sails
