Remarks on Board Sunday August 28, 1836

28 The 24 hours commences with light winds from the West at noon stand for the before mentioned Islands at 2 struck one the boats in shore of more at 4 pm took him along side and commenced cutting at 8 Sat the watch heading to the South at daylight commenced cutting at 9 am finish at 10 am heard the Island of Pico and Fayal bearing East by compass stand East San Bruchon lat by obs 38:22 North long by lat 30:00 West

Remarks on Board Monday August 29, 1836

29 at 1 pm stand W by E employed in chasing away the head at 2 stand for wharfs at 3 am on board and commence boiling down a whale ship steaming in for the land at stand by to the South with light show of rain at 2 am took ship to the West at 8 am stand S by E employed in boiling lat by obs 38:28 North long by lat 29:46 West

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 30 1836

30 First Port Moderate winds from the SW stand ESE employed in boiling one sail in sight at 1 pm heard Fayal bearing East by compass at 4 finished boiling and left two the wind heading South by West at midnight took ship to the North at 4 am stand West and at 8 am sent the boat on shore ship standing off and on so ends

Remarks on Board Wednesday August 31, 1836

31 Employed in getting vegetables on board and landing oil 9 locks at 8 am on board layed off and on accompanied with rain latter Port fresh gusts from the W at 11 am double crew the foremast employed in coopersing our oil lat by obs 38:28 North

Remarks on Board Thursday September 1, 1836

32 First Port Strong gale from the WSE employed in boiling ship to the windward and rather ship duty middle Port more moderate at 7 am went on shore at 10 Discharge 14 casks of sperm oil containing 3742 Gallons in all of 128 Barrels so ends

Remarks on Board Friday September 2 1836

33 at 4 pm the Boat came on board and put to sea stand SW by S with all sail set at 7 pm stand South winds WSE the Island of Fayal bore South 10 miles and the Peak of Pico bore E by N 10 miles from which I took my Departure middle Port calm latter Port light air from the WSW 2 sail in sight at noon the Peak of Pico bore North 33 miles distant Variation 2 Points Westerly lat by obs 37:54 North long by lat 28:28 West

Remarks on Board Saturday September 3 1836

34 The 24 hours commences with light winds from the WSW leave South with all drawing sail set employed in ship duty middle and latter Port much the same same circumstances one sail in sight lat by obs 36:33 North long by lat 27:36 West Variation 2 Points Westerly

Remarks on Board Sunday September 4 1836

35 The 24 hours commences with fine breeze from the WSW stand South at 3 pm stand S by W with all sail set one sail in sight middle Port calm accompanied with rain latter Port light air from the North and ahead San Francisco lat by obs 34:56 North long by lat 27:00 West Variation 2 Points Westerly
